RESOLUTION NO. 94-062

WHEREAS,	the international boundary between the United States
	and the Republic of Mexico, for a distance of 85 miles,
	forms the southern border of the main reservation of
	the Tohono O'Odham Nation; and

- WHEREAS, the international boundary also artificially divides the

 Tohono O'Odham people and their O'Odham relatives

 in Mexico; and
- WHEREAS, the existence of the international boundary as the southern border of the Tohono O'Odham reservation has created severe and costly problems for the Tohono O'Odham Nation including, among other things:
 - (1) illegal entry of non-O'Odham Mexican nationals across the border which, among other things, has resulted in physical assaults upon, and the theft of property from, members of the Tohono O'Odham Nation;
 - (2) cross-border trafficking in illegal drugs, and rustling of cattle and other livestock of Tohono O'Odham people;
 - (3) potential pollution of aquifers underlying the lands of the Tohono O'Odham Nation from mining activities occurring across the border in Mexico;
 - (4) the need to repair and maintain the fence along that border; and

WHEREAS, the existence of the border, and the policies and attitudes of the Custom and Immigration Agencies of both the United States and the Republic of Mexico have imposed harsh, restrictive, and unnecessary barriers against the efforts of the O'Odham people of the United States and of Mexico to maintain their family, cultural, and religious ties; and

WHEREAS, the responsibility for meeting and resolving the financial and cultural burdens imposed upon the Tohono O'Odham Nation by the existence of the international boundary should be borne by the Federal Government and not the Nation; and

WHEREAS, the Nation has been frustrated in its attempts to secure commitments from Federal Agencies, including the Bureau of Indian Affairs, the Indian Health Service, the Bureau of Land Management, the United States Custom Service, Immigration & Naturalization Service, the Drug Enforcement Administration, and the Department of State, to acknowledge and shoulder their responsibilities for meeting these burdens; and

WHEREAS, the Nation believes that the resolution of these

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'Odham

Legislative Council that an urgent request be made to
Senator Daniel K. Inouye, Chairman of the Committee
on Indian Affairs of the United States Senate, and
Congressman Bill Richardson, Chairman of the
Subcommittee on Native American Affairs of the
Committee on Natural Resources of the United States
House of Representatives, that they separately or
jointly schedule an oversight hearing on the various
problems and burdens created for the Nation arising
from the international boundary as set out above.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that such oversight hearing be scheduled in April or May of this year, in a site readily accessible to the Nation, preferably in Sells, Arizona, the capitol of the Tohono O'Odham Nation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in addition to appropriate witnesses from the Nation, responsible representatives of the appropriate Federal agencies be required to present testimony at such hearings.
