27		a. Indian graveyard structures situated on Tract No.
28		C-314-E-3, existing as of the date of taking, are

reserved to the Tohono O'Odham Nation, San Lucy District, and its successors, including all such rights and privileges including burial rights without interfering with or abridging the Corp' flowage easement.

b. As to Tract No. C-314-E-3, a perpetual and assignable easement and right of way, exists to locate, construct, operate, maintain, repair and remove a dike for the protection of an Indian cemetery against inundation by water of the Gila River resulting from the operation of the Painted Rock Dam and Reservoir in, upon over and across the land described as Tract No. C-314-E-3, subject to existing burial rights in said Indian cemetery; and

WHEREAS, according to certain Corps documents (Design Memorandum No. 2, Real Estate for Painted Rock Reservoir, October 1954; Appraisal Report 1954; Operation and Maintenance Manual for Painted Rock

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Reservoir, July 1963), the Corps. has a long term obligation to maintain the cemetery levee ring; and

WHEREAS, the 1993 Flood event at Painted Rock inundated the historical San Lucy District Indian cemetery, damaged the integrity of said levee, and washed away certain segments of the original access road; and

on July 22, 1993, the San Lucy District of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, documented certain determinations jointly made between the District and Corps personnel concerning flood damage and rehabilitation of the District's historical cemetery, wherein, the District Chairperson agreed to assign District staff to the repair project and complete the project in a spirit of partnership and collaboration; and

WHEREAS, a circular from Commissioner McFarland of the U.S.

Department of Interior General Land Office, 3 Land

Decision 371 (May 31, 1884), directed General Land Office

officers to ascertain whether any lands in their
iurisdiction are occupied by Indian inhabitants, and the

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locality of their possession and improvements as near as may be and to allow no entries of filing upon any such lands; and

WHEREAS, in order to make repairs both immediately and in the future, to the levee and to acquire a perpetual easement to the cemetery site for future operation and maintenance of the levee ring, the Corps staked out a proposed new access road, determined certain areas need for long term repair and maintenance of the levee and identified construction areas. (See legal description incorporated herein as Exhibit A and proposed plan and profile incorporated herein as Exhibit B); and

the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council has determined that granting the Corps a right-of-way for the purposes described herein would be in the best interests of the Nation as a whole; and

WHEREAS, the Nation is aware of a purported conveyance of land which includes the area of right-of-way, approximately 30 feet directly surrounding what has been called in the

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documents the toe of the levee, by approval of a "Correction Quit Claim Deed" as referenced in Papago Tribal Council Resolution Number 1456, on May 6, 1966, for the purpose of correcting a Quit Claim Deed dated March 27, 1961; and

WHEREAS, nothing in this Resolution is intended, nor should it be construed to (1) waive any claim the Nation may have that the purported conveyance under the Correction Quit Claim Deed is invalid and of no legal force and effect or (2) waive, cede or otherwise relinquish any interest the Nation may have in the land purportedly conveyed described in Exhibit A attached, and located in section 23 surrounding the exterior toe of the levee.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council that:

 The BIA is requested to provide and grant of right-ofway over and across tribal land described in Exhibit A and B attached and incorporated herefor, at such time that the Corps has met all requirements in 25

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CFR Parts 169 and 170, provisions of the Nation's laws and ordinances and other BIA guidance for the purposes stated herein.

- 2. That the BIA is requested to approve immediately, provided the Corps is in compliance with all relevant and applicable regulations, a right of entry for the purposes of immediate repairs to the dike and to make necessary preparations for such repairs.
- 3. The Tohono O'Odham Nation may consider recommending to the Secretary of the Interior, or his authorized representative waiver of any consideration, fees and or damages incident to the grant of the right-of-way upon review of the Corps' appraisal, and a determination by the Nation that the payment of fair value for the easement would be offset by improvements or other benefits to the Tohono O'Odham Nation.
- 4. The Chairperson of the San Lucy District of the Tohono O'Odham Nation shall designate a person

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who will coordinate this project with the BIA and Corps; such written designation shall be made within five days from the date of approval of this resolution.

5. The Tohono O'Odham Nation hereby endorses the Corps plan and description incorporated as Exhibits A and B and as modified enlarging the construction easement around the perimeter of Papago Tribal Cemetery, as described in the index to contract drawings as presented to the Legislative Council during the presentation this date.

The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council on the <u>6TH.</u> day of <u>MAY</u>, <u>1994</u> at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of <u>1,763.0</u> FOR; <u>-0-AGAINST</u>; <u>-0-NOT VOTING</u>; and <u>05-ABSENT</u>, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section <u>1(i and 2(d))</u> of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'Odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
