- (e) There does not now or in the future exist a credible basis on which to conclude that the Mortons misrepresented, or failed to disclose, facts material to any matter involving the Nation's interests.
- 2. In consultation with the Nation's Attorney General and the Investment Committee, the Chairman of the Nation is authorized and directed to execute escrow instructions, a partial settlement agreement and such other documents as may be required to implement this Resolution on the terms prescribed above.

The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council on the <u>8TH.</u> day of <u>JUNE</u>, <u>1994</u> at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of <u>1,665.0</u> FOR; <u>-0-AGAINST</u>; <u>-0-NOT VOTING</u>; and <u>98.0 [04] ABSENT</u>, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section <u>1(d)(1)</u>, (2) & (3) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'Odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
