 WHEREAS, the Human Resource Development Committee (HRDC) of

 the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council is charged with

 use of condemned classroom trailers at the Santa Rosa
 Ranch School (SRRS) in jeopardy of the safety of students
 and staff at SRRS; and

WHEREAS, on September 16, 1994, the smell of smoke was detected
 in one of the condemned classroom trailers causing the
 school to vacate the facilities; and

WHEREAS, following this incident, HRDC and SRRS attempted to
 contact the Agency Superintendent of Education, George
 Scott, but he was not available for consultation; and

21WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council then called a22special session on September 19, 1994, to address this23critical issue; and

WHEREAS, the Legislative Council called another special session on
 September 21, 1994 to hear from the Superintendent of

5	WHEREAS,	during this session, Mr. Scott demonstrated a lack of

9		replace the SRRS classrooms had been known to Mr.					
10		Scott since at least January of 1994, but the					
11		Superintendent of Education chose to take no action to					
12		replace, remove or otherwise address the condition of					
13		the unsafe classrooms; and

15	WHEREAS,	the Superintendent informed the Legislative Council at					
16		the September 21, 1994 session that the reason he could					
17		take no action to address the problem was because only					
18		Assistant Secretary Ada Deer could approve allocation of					
19		funds to deal with this emergency situation; and

21	WHEREAS,	the Chairperson of HRDC was later informed that the					
22		Phoenix Area Director had full authority to correct this					
23		safety hazard and there was currently \$165,000 available					
24		at the Area Office for such purpose; and					
25	WHEREAS	contacts were then made with BIA Phoenix Area Office

27		and the hazard was quickly addressed; and					
28	WHEREAS,	further investigation revealed numerous complaints

8		without adequate classroom supplies, specifically					
9		textbooks; and					
10	WHEREAS,	although the Superintendent of Education states he					
11		never received purchase order requesting textbooks, the					
12		school staff insists purchase orders were submitted for

14		textbooks; and					
15	WHEREAS,	the School Board of Tohono O'odham High School passed					
16		a Resolution dated September 26, 1994 recommending					
17		that the Agency Superintendent curtail his travel and					
18		attend to improving education at the Bureau Schools;
