RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL (Supporting the Peace Caravan to Chiapas, Mexico) 1 **RESOLUTION NO. 94-527** 2 WHEREAS, on January 1, 1994, the American public became aware 3 of the harsh treatment and conditions experienced by 4 5 the Mayan people in the state of Chiapas in Southern 6 Mexico; and 7 WHEREAS, these unbearable living conditions have driven the 8 9 Mayans to take extreme actions, i.e. military actions, and 10 has resulted in the loss of human life; and 11 WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation is gravely concerned about 12 the state of conditions and treatment of the Mayans by 13 14 the Mexican Government through the use of its military 15 might; and 16 WHEREAS, members of the Tohono O'odham Nation do reside in 17 Mexico, in the state of Sonora, are governed by the same 18 19 Mexican government and policies and are experiencing 20 the same harsh treatment and conditions as the Mayans: 21 and 22 23 WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation recognizes the Mayan 24 People as relatives based on the beliefs through culture 25 and customs as Indigenous People: and 26 WHEREAS, in an effort to bring some relief to the Mayan People. a 27 28 caravan of supplies is being coordinated to deliver nonperishable food items and other goods to the region; and WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation is a willing participant to assist to bring about peace and social justice to the Mayan People.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Nation that it does support the Peace Caravan to Chiapas by contributing \$1,000.00 from the Executive Public Relations Account for food supplies and \$3,000.00 from the General Revenue Fund to fully finance a Tohono O'odham representative to accompany the Peace Caravan to Chiapas.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Nation urges the Mexican government to seek peaceful solutions rather than the use of Mexican Military when negotiating with the Indigenous Mayans, with sincere consideration of the Mayan proposal for peace.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Nation recognizes
the inherent Indigenous rights of the Mayan and other
Indigenous People of Mexico, including Tohono
O'odham, and respectfully urges the Mexican
Government to do the same.

The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council on the <u>9TH.</u> day of <u>DECEMBER</u>, <u>1994</u> at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of <u>1,533.0</u> FOR; <u>-0-AGAINST</u>; <u>-0-NOT VOTING</u>; and <u>230.0 [05] ABSENT</u>, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section <u>1(d)(2), (c)(2) & (8)</u> of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'Odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
