Department, did apply for and receive \$186,000.00 for emergency roof repairs for homes damaged in the August 12, 1994 storm that affected seven districts of the Nation (those being: Hickiwan. Pisinemo, Gu Vo, Gu Achi, Baboquivari, Schuk Toak and Sif Oidak). NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council that the Tohono O'Odham Nation's Treasury Department, Grants and Contracts, is authorized to establish an account for expenditures on the approved projects and disperse federal monies as invoices are submitted and labor is performed following all of the Nation's procedures.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that expenditures related to roof repairs may be made from the Nation's General Fund account pending reimbursement by HUD's Imminent Threat monies, the total not to exceed \$186,000.
