RESOLUTION NO. 95-120

WHEREAS, the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council is charged with the responsibility to support and oversee programs that will benefit the Tohono O'Odham Nation as a whole; and

WHEREAS, the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council is cognizant of the need to strengthen science, mathematics, and technology education for all Tohono O'Odham students to better prepare them for the future; and

WHEREAS, the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council was informed of the Arizona Tribal Coalition's intent to focus on delivering more meaningful science, mathematics and technology education by including community involvement thus reflecting Tohono O'Odham perspectives; and

WHEREAS, the efforts of the Arizona Tribal Coalition in conjunction with the Utah, Colorado, Arizona, New Mexico - Rural Systemic Initiative in writing a proposal, that, if funded will provide \$10 million over five years to the four state areas of the UCAN-RSI.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council hereby supports UCAN-RSI and the Arizona Tribal Coalition efforts to pursue funding from the National Science Foundation to improve science, mathematics and technology education.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council supports the establishment of a formal relationship among the Tohono O'Odham Nation, UCAN-RSI and the Arizona Tribal Coalition.

The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council on the 10TH day of MARCH, 1995 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1,255.0 FOR; -0- AGAINST; -0- NOT VOTING; and 508.0 [14] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section 1(f) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'Odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
