3 **WHEREAS,** the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council is charged with the  
4  
5 responsibility to support and oversee programs that will benefit the  
6  
7 Tohono O'Odham Nation as a whole; and

8 **WHEREAS,** the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council is cognizant of the need  
9  
10 to strengthen, preserve and maintain the Tohono O'Odham Himdag  
11  
12 which is inclusive of the Tohono O'Odham language; and

13 **WHEREAS,** existing supporting documents to strengthen, preserve and maintain  
14  
15 the Tohono O'Odham Himdag include the Comprehensive Education  
16  
17 Plan, 1982; the Language Policy of the Tohono O'Odham Nation,  
18  
19 1984; the Tohono O'Odham Education Standards, 1987 and the  
20  
21 Administrative Plan of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, 1994; and

22 **WHEREAS,** the Tohono O'Odham Education Department is applying for funding  
23  
24 from the Department of Health and Human Services, Administration  
25  
26 for Children and Families, Administration for Native Americans to  
27  
28 promote the survival and continuing vitality of the Tohono  
O'Odham language which will allow the Tohono O'Odham  
Community to establish long range goals; and

3 **WHEREAS, the Health and Human Services Administration for Children and**  
4  
5 **Families, Administration for Native Americans require a 20% tribal**  
6  
7 **in-kind contribution of the total budge which is reflected in this**  
8  
9 **budget in the amount of \$10,000.**

10 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'Odham Legislative**  
11  
12 **Council supports the Tohono O'Odham Education Department's**  
13  
14 **efforts to apply for funding in the amount of \$50,000.00 from the**  
15  
16 **Department of Health and Human Services, Administration for**  
17  
18 **Children and Families, Administration for Native Americans.**

19 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that upon receipt of this one-year planning grant,**  
20  
21 **the Tohono O'Odham Education Department will become eligible to**  
22  
23 **apply for a larger grant to design and implement a Tohono**  
24  
25 **O'Odham Language Program.**

26 **The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council**  
27 **on the 10TH. day of MARCH, 1995 at a meeting at which a quorum was**  
28 **present with a vote of 1,255.0 FOR; -0- AGAINST; -0- NOT VOTING; and 508.0**  
**[14] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section 1(f) of**  
**Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, adopted by the**  
**Tohono O'Odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting**
