3 **WHEREAS,** the Tohono O'odham Nation has provided preventive health care for
4
5 women, infants and children during Fiscal Year 1995; and

6 **WHEREAS,** the Inter-Tribal Council of Arizona receives funds from the United
7
8 States Department of Agriculture for programs designed to benefit
9
10 women, infants and children; and

11 **WHEREAS,** the Tohono O'odham Nation has entered into a Memorandum of
12
13 Agreement with Inter-Tribal Council of Arizona to fund and operate
14
15 the Women, Infants and Children (WIC) program, and

16 **WHEREAS,** services provided to eligible clients have been beneficial and services
17
18 continue to be necessary to help alleviate nutritional health risks
19
20 and improve the health of individuals at risk.

21 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council
22
23 that it does hereby approve the application for funding from the
24
25 Inter-Tribal Council of Arizona, to continue to operate and provide
26
27 services to eligible women, infants and children.

28 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the term of this Memorandum of Agreement
will commence on October 01, 1995 through September 30, 1996

5 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that the
6 Tohono O'odham Nation will not fund or operate the program in
7 the interim while negotiations are still being conducted and no
8 executed Agreement has been approved by the Inter-Tribal Council
9 of Arizona.

12 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that the
13 Tohono O'odham Nation's Officials, to wit: the Chairman and any
14 designated Official are hereby authorized to negotiate and execute
15 the Memorandum of Agreement, provided however, that any
16 amendments affecting the funding or funding levels of the
17 Memorandum of Agreement shall be submitted for further prior
18 approval by this Council.

23 The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council
24 the 18TH, day of May, 1995 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with
25 a vote of 1,349.0 FOR; -0- AGAINST; -0- NOT VOTING; and [414.0] 09
26 ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section 1(f) of Article
27 VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono
28 O'Odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy
Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to
Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).


