

RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(Support to Develop and Implement a Grant Proposal in Collaboration
with Pima Community College, the University of Arizona and
the Pascua Yaqui Tribe for a Tribal Languages Professional
Training Program funded by the U.S. Department of
Education [CFDA 844.288B])

RESOLUTION NO. 95-393

WHEREAS, the Legislative Council of the Tohono O'Odham Nation is
empowered to promote the health, welfare and education of the
membership of the Nation and considers educational advancement
of tribal members as among the highest of priorities; and

WHEREAS, the Council is constitutionally authorized to negotiate and conclude
agreements on behalf of the Nation with other tribes and
educational institutions in order to secure and foster greater
benefits, opportunities and educational access for the tribal
membership; and

WHEREAS, the tribal language of the Tohono O'Odham Nation is endangered
and there is a critical need for trained O'Odham professional
language teachers who can insure the integrity and continuation of
the language for future generations by integrating it into school
curriculum and teaching it to our children; and

WHEREAS, the Tohono O'Odham Nation intends to actively participate as lead

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grantee and fiscal agent in the proposed collaboration with Pima
Community College, the University of Arizona and Pascua Yaqui
Tribe for the purpose of applying for a grant from the United
States Department of Education (CFDA 844.288B) and conducting an
Indian language teachers professional education program that will
increased employment opportunities of Indian professionals an
paraprofessionals while serving Tohono O'Odham and Yaqui school
students in Arizona schools, colleges and universities.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'Odham Legislative
endorses the joint grant application to be submitted by the
collaborating parties consisting of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, the
Pascua Yaqui Tribe, Pima Community College and the University of
Arizona to the Office of Indian Education, U.S. Department of
Education (CFDA 844.288B) as provided by 34 CFR 75.127-75.129
(1994), agrees that the Nation will be the lead grantee and fiscal

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agent, and requests the Nation's Chairman to sign this resolution of support.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman of the Tohono O'Odham Nation,

or his designee, is requested to sign a proposal pre-agreement and to subsequently negotiate and enter into any sub-agreements or intergovernmental agreements with the other parties in this collaboration, subject to the approval of the Legislative Council, upon award of a grant from the U.S. Department of Education.

The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council on the 11TH day of AUGUST, 1995 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1,430.0 FOR; 281.5 AGAINST; 164.5 NOT VOTING; and 05 ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section 1(f) & (c)(8) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'Odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
