Such records as well as all original entry transaction records shall be maintained for at least five years from the date on which they are made. The auditors shall submit to the Chairman of the Nation an audit report expressing an unqualified or qualified opinion, or, if appropriate, disclaim an opinion of the statement taken as a whole in accordance which generally accepted auditing standards of the accounting profession. The examination and audit shall disclose whether the accounts, records, expenditures and internal controls and accounting procedures maintained by the District are in compliance with this Resolution, Section 302 of the
