

**RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(Appropriating \$6,048.00 for Border Crossing Workers)**

RESOLUTION NO. 95-480

WHEREAS, the Mexican Government established the "Sonora Only" Program to ease Border Crossing into the State of Sonora, Mexico, and

WHEREAS, The "Sonora Only" Program will appropriately accommodate O'odham for the St. Francis pilgrimage to Magdalena, Sonora through the Nogales Port of Entry; and

WHEREAS, arrangements have been made with the Mexican Government to allow members of the Tohono O'odham Nation to drive their vehicles into Mexico during the period of September 30 through October 6, 1995 for the Feast of St. Francis without having to pay the usual import fee at the Lukeville Port of Entry; and

WHEREAS, representatives of the Tohono O'odham Nation and the Mexican Government agency INI will be at the Lukeville Port of Entry from 6:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. during the aforementioned days to assist members of the Tohono O'odham Nation is crossing the International Border; and

WHEREAS, through recommendations from various districts an "O'odham Informational and Assistance" booth will be placed in Magdalena, Sonora during the St. Francis Feast to assist any O'odham in case of emergencies; and

WHEREAS, a number of six workers will be sufficient to effectuate the assistance process with the border crossing with minimum problems; and

WHEREAS, two employees of the Nation who are experienced with border crossing will provide supervision of the process during the time period of September 30, 1995 through October 6, 1995.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that six border crossing workers will be hired and paid according to the budget incorporated herein with this resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the funding amount of \$6,048.00 be appropriated from the General Revenues of FY 1996.




