

**RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL**  
**(Requesting National Congress of American Indians Support for the**  
1 **Planning and Development of Intermediate Care Options for the Nation's**  
2 **Elders)**

**RESOLUTION NO. 95-511**

5 **WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation has been deeply concerned about**  
6  
7 **the inadequacy of supportive services provided to our elders;**  
8  
9 **and**

10 **WHEREAS, where such services are being provided, they generally follow**  
11  
12 **criteria which do not fulfill the needs of allowing O'odham to**  
13  
14 **live out their lives according to their own accustomed cultural,**  
15 **emotional and physical needs; and**  
16

17 **WHEREAS, the demand for health care will increase as the O'odham grow**  
18  
19 **and life expectancy improves; and**

20 **WHEREAS, the Legislative Council and Chairman of the Tohono O'odham**  
21  
22 **Nation has made better services to the elderly a major**  
23  
24 **priority; and**

25 **WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation is firmly committed to the**  
26  
27 **planning and construction of a Nation operation Skilled**  
28 **Nursing Facility; and**

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**4 WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation also recognizes the opportunity to  
5  
6 develop intermediate care options in an overall Elderly Care  
7  
8 Continuum of Care Plan for the Nation.**

**9 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED the Tohono O'odham Nation is  
10  
11 requesting support from the National Congress of American  
12  
13 Indians (NCAI) for set aside Congressional Appropriations for  
14  
15 the planning and development of intermediate care programs  
16  
17 to assist the Indian Nations provide a continuum of care to its  
18  
19 elderlys.**


**20 The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'Odham Legislative  
21 Council on the 20TH. day of OCTOBER 1995 at a meeting at which a  
22 quorum was present with a vote of 1,315.0 FOR; 0 AGAINST; 0 NOT  
23 VOTING; and 561.0(09) ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the  
24 Council by Section 1(c)(2) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono  
25 O'Odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'Odham Nation on January 18,  
26 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian  
27 Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act  
28 of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).**




