WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham are descendants of the HoHokam Indian people and were located in southwestern Arizona from time immemorial; and

WHEREAS, a majority of the Tohono O'odham people continue to adhere to, and practice, the religious and cultural beliefs and traditions of their ancestors; and

WHEREAS, the immemorial tradition and belief of the O'odham people establishes the Baboquivari Peak and Mountain of southwestern Arizona as the center of Mother Earth and the dwelling place of I'itoi, the Creator, and holds that desecration of the mountain will lead to the destruction and end of the universe and the O'odham people; and

WHEREAS, members of the Tohono O'odham Nation continue to use the Baboquivari Peak on a daily basis as a part of their religious and cultural belief and practices; and

WHEREAS, in the establishment of the Main Reservation of the Tohono O'odham Nation by the Executive Order of February 1, 1917, a portion of the

WHEREAS,

eastern boundary followed the crest of the Baboquivari Mountains, bisecting Baboquivari Peak and leaving only the western half of the Peak in the ownership of the Nation, despite the fact that the mountain has been, from time immemorial, the central religious and cultural site of the Nation and the sacred symbol of its people; and eastern portion of the Baboquivari Peak was included as a component of the National Wilderness Preservation System by section 101(a)(1) of the Arizona Desert Wilderness Act of 1990 (P. L. 101-628; 104 Stat. 4469); and

WHEREAS, the exclusion of the eastern portion of the Baboquivari Peak from the Nation's ownership in 1917, and the inclusion of the area as a component of the National Wilderness Preservation System, has frustrated the ability of the Tohono O'odham people in the practice of their religion; and

WHEREAS, the Forty-second Legislature of the State of Arizona passed, on March 26, 1996, House Concurrent Memorial 2005 which prays--

"That the Congress of the United States enact legislation to transfer in trust that portion of the Baboquivari peak consisting

RESOLUTION NO. 96-221 (NCAI Support of the Return of Baboquivari Peak) 1 Page 3 of 5 2 3 of federal lands for inclusion in the Tohono O'odham Indian 4 Reservation."; and 5 6 WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation is seeking the enactment of legislation 7 for the restoration of Baboquivari Peak to the Nation and needs the 8 9 support of other Indian tribes and organizations, including the 10 **National Congress of American Indians.** 11 12 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative 13 Council requests that the National Congress of American Indians, 14 15 assembled in Tulsa, Oklahoma, on June 3-5, 1996, for its Mid-year 16 conference, do adopt a resolution supporting the efforts of the Nation 17 18 to secure legislation returning this religious site to the Nation. 19 20 The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'Odham Council on the 3RD. day of JUNE, 1996 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote 21 1.876.0 FOR; -0- AGAINST; -0- NOT VOTING; and [04] ABSENT, pursuant to the 22 powers vested in the Council by Article VI, Section 1 (c)(8) of the Constitution of 23 the Tohono O'Odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'Odham Nation on January 24 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs 25 (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
