and State agencies to support the Tohono O'odham Nation's Livestock Owners
due to the drought conditions on the Nation)

RESOLUTION NO. 96-241

WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation is a Federally recognized Indian Tribe
by the United States Government and the Secretary of the Interior;
and

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of Arizona has declared a drought
emergency and requested assistance from the appropriate federal
disaster programs; and

WHEREAS, the Eleven Districts of the Tohono O'odham Nation have submitted
their funding request, based on their needs due to the drought; and

WHEREAS, the Nation is requesting immediate assistance from all state and
federal agencies as directed by the Governor's Declaration of
Emergency; and

WHEREAS, the funding amount is based on anticipated drought period of three
months.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative
Council is requesting 3.9 million dollars for emergency drought relief
to purchase needed feed, water troughs, water tanks, well engines
and other related materials.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Nation declare a drought emergency and request assistance from the appropriate federal disaster aid programs.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council hereby authorizes the Chairman to request such funding from the appropriated federal aid programs.

The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'Odham Council on the 7TH day of JUNE, 1996 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote 1,876.0 FOR; -0- AGAINST; -0- NOT VOTING; and [07] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Article VI, Section 1 (i)(2) of the Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'Odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).


