(FY 1997 Women, Infants and Children Program Proposal)**

**RESOLUTION NO. 96-253**

**WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation has provided preventive health care for women, infants and children during Fiscal Year 1996; and**

**WHEREAS, the Inter-Tribal Council of Arizona receives funds from the United States Department of Agriculture for programs designed to benefit women, infants and children; and**

**WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation has entered into a Memorandum of Agreement with Inter-Tribal Council of Arizona to fund and operate the Women, Infants and Children (WIC) program; and**

**WHEREAS, services provided to eligible clients have been beneficial and services continue to be necessary to help alleviate nutritional health risks and improve the health of individuals at risk.**

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that it does hereby approve the application for funding from the Inter-Tribal Council of Arizona, to continue to operate and provide services to eligible women, infants and children.**

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the term of this Memorandum of Agreement will commence on October 01, 1996 through September 30, 1997**

11 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that the  
12 Tohono O'odham Nation's Officials, to wit: the Chairman and any  
13 designated Official are hereby authorized to negotiate and execute  
14 the Memorandum of Agreement, provided however, that any  
15 amendments affecting the funding or funding levels of the  
16 Memorandum of Agreement shall be submitted for further prior  
17 approval by this Council.

22 The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'Odham Council on the  
23 27TH. day of JUNE, 1996 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a  
24 vote 1,876.0 FOR; -0- AGAINST; -0- NOT VOTING; and [02] ABSENT, pursuant to  
25 the powers vested in the Council by Article VI, Section 1 (f) of the Constitution  
26 of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'Odham Nation on  
27 January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian  
28 Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June  
18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).






