**RESOLUTION NO. 96-264**

**WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation is presently operating the Law  
Enforcement and Detention Services/Anti-Drug Program under FY  
1996 P.L. 93-638 contract with the Bureau of Indian Affairs; and**

**WHEREAS, such tribal operations have been successful and beneficial to the  
Tohono O'odham Nation and its people; and**

**WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation does desire to renew for provision of  
services during FY 1997; and**

**WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council has reviewed and approved  
the FY 1997 Law Enforcement and Detention Services/ Anti-Drug  
Program renewal proposal and budgets.**

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council  
that it does authorize and request the Bureau of Indian Affairs to  
renew with the Tohono O'odham Nation under P.L. 93-638 as  
amended for the provision of services titled: Law Enforcement and  
Detention Services.**

4 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the duration of this renewal shall commence on

6 **October 01, 1996 through September 30, 1997.**

7 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that the

9 **Tohono O'odham Nation will not fund or operate the program in the**  
10 **interim while negotiations are still being conducted and no executed**  
11 **contract has been approved by the Bureau of Indian Affairs, unless**  
12 **the agency authorizes and approves pre-award costs consistent with**  
13 **the agency authorizes and approves pre-award costs consistent with**  
14 **the Indian Self-Determination Act, as amended.**

16 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that the  
17  
18 **Tohono O'odham Nation's Officials to wit: the Chairman and any**  
19 **designated official are hereby authorized to negotiate and execute**  
20 **the contract, provided however, that any amendments affecting the**  
21 **funding or funding levels of the contract shall be submitted for**  
22 **further prior approval by this Council.**

**the powers vested in the Council by Article VI, Section 1 (f) of the Constitution**
