6 **replacing Comprehensive Employment Training Act (CETA); and**

8 **WHEREAS, the Job Training Partnership Act (JTPA) funds are made available**

10 **to State and Tribal Governments from the United States Department**
11 **of Labor to establish employment and training programs for**
12 **improving the employment prospects of eligible persons; and**

14 **WHEREAS, Indian Reservations in Arizona have been designated as service**
15 **delivery areas and are eligible to receive Federal JTPA funds; and**

16
17 **WHEREAS, the Nation is entitled to JTPA funds to develop a network of**
18 **employment training programs throughout the Nation; and**

20 **WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation has operated the Title II-B Program**
21 **since 1974; and**

23 **WHEREAS, the JTPA Program has received the funding amount from the**
24 **Department of Labor in the amounts of:**

26 - **Administrative Cost Pool Budget at \$16,936.**

28 - **Program Budget at \$95,971.**
