WHEREAS, the gaming activities of the Tohono O'odham Nation are an exercise of the Nation's right to make its own laws, to control its own institutions, and to determine its own forms of economic development; and

WHEREAS, the conduct of gaming has contributed substantially to the Nation's ability to achieve economic self-sufficiency and to provide for the needs of the members of the Nation; and

WHEREAS, the people of the Salt River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community have been denied the opportunity to engage in gaming activities on the same basis as the Nation and the fifteen other Arizona tribes which have entered into tribal-state gaming compacts with the State of Arizona.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative

Council supports the right of the Salt River Pima-Maricopa Indian

Community to obtain a tribal-state gaming compact.
