

RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(Amendment to the FY 1997 Inter-Tribal Council of Arizona Women, Infants
and Children Program Base Budget)

RESOLUTION NO. 96-495

WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation has provided preventive health care for
women, infants and children during Fiscal Year 1996; and

WHEREAS, the Inter-Tribal Council of Arizona receives funds from the United
States Department of Agriculture for programs designed to benefit
women, infants and children; and

WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation has entered into a Memorandum of
Agreement with Inter-Tribal Council of Arizona to fund and operate
the Women, Infants and Children (WIC) program; and

WHEREAS, due to a decrease on the ITCA/WIC agreement, based on current
caseload of less than 1,000 participants, a decrease of funding to
\$129,000.00 from \$129,962 will reflect a modification to the FY97
tribal base; and

WHEREAS, should there be a increase in caseload additional funds maybe made
available by Inter-Tribal Council of Arizona due to funding
availability.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that it does hereby approve the application for funding from the Inter-Tribal Council of Arizona, and to incorporate the indirect cost rate.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that it does hereby approve the application for funding from the Inter-Tribal Council to continue to operate and provide services to eligible women, infants and children.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the term of this Memorandum of Agreement will commence on October 01, 1996 through September 30, 2001 unless extended by mutual agreement of both parties.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that the Tohono O'odham Nation will not fund or operate the program in the interim while negotiations are still being conducted and no executed Agreement has been approved by the Inter-Tribal Council of Arizona.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that the Tohono O'odham Nations's Officials, to wit: the Chairman and any designated Official are hereby authorized to negotiate and execute the Memorandum of Agreement, provided however, that any amendments affecting the funding levels of the Memorandum of Agreement shall be submitted for further prior approval by this Council.

The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'Odham Council on the 9TH. day of OCTOBER, 1996 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote 1,562.0 FOR; -0- AGAINST; -0- NOT VOTING; and 314.0 [05] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Article VI, Section 1(f), of the Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'Odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
