**WHEREAS, the Nation successfully applied for and received conditional  
award of EPA funds for Border Infrastructure projects; and**

**WHEREAS, the EPA has made this award contingent on the requisite  
bathrooms construction to complete the water and  
wastewater projects funded under this grant; and**

**WHEREAS, the EPA has agreed to keep its funds committed to Tohono  
O'odham Nation projects, provided the Nation provides  
assurances that it will commit efforts to locate construction  
funds for the EPA Border Grant projects at Pia Oik, Gu Vo,  
Little Tucson/Artesia and Cowlic communities, to include all  
possible grant programs from Federal, State and Local  
sources up to and including Tribal resources.**

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative  
Council hereby resolves to provide the necessary assurances  
that the Tohono O'odham Nation will commit all necessary  
and appropriate efforts to locate construction funds to meet  
the contingency requirements of the EPA Border  
Infrastructure grant award.**


