

**RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL  
(FY 1998 Ranger Program Interim Three (3) Month Budget)**

**RESOLUTION NO. 97-454**

**WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation has previously funded Ranger activities operated by Gu Vo, Chukut Kuk and Pisinemo Districts through its general fund revenues; and**

**WHEREAS, the Nation has been successful in obtaining federal funding through the P.L. 93-638 process to provide for these activities under the auspices of the Nation's Law Enforcement Department; and**

**WHEREAS, it has been the intent of the Nation that the operations of the District Ranger Programs be a component of the Law Enforcement Department once federal funding is identified and made available; and**

**WHEREAS, transferring the existing Ranger operations to the Department requires a transitional period during which it is necessary to maintain funding from the Nation's general fund for which the Executive Branch has prepared and presented an interim three (3) month budget.**

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that the Ranger Programs of the Gu Vo District, Chukut Kuk and Pisinemo District continue to operate pursuant to the attached budget prepared and presented by the Executive Branch.**

2 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Ranger Programs shall operate under the

4 **direct supervision of the Tohono O'odham Nation Law**  
5 **Enforcement Department.**

6 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the districts with the assistance of the  
7 **Accounting Department** prepare an inventory and account for all  
8 **equipment, vehicles, and other items purchased for use in the**  
9 **Ranger operations which shall be transferred to the Tohono**  
10 **O'odham Nation Law Enforcement Department.**

12 **BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED** that funding for the interim three (3) month budget  
13 **shall be appropriated from the General Fund revenues.**

14 **The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Council on the**  
15 **10TH. day of OCTOBER, 1997 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with**  
16 **a vote of 1,738.0 FOR; 189.0 AGAINST; -0- NOT VOTING; and [03] ABSENT,**  
17 **pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section 1(d)(2) & (3) of Article**  
18 **VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono**  
19 **O'Odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy**  
20 **Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant**  
21 **to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).**
