2 WHEREAS, in September 1996 the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council 3 passed Resolution No. 96-420 opposing the transfer of Bureau of 4 Indian Affairs Law Enforcement/Tribal Court functions to the 5 Department of Justice, but with the presentation of new 6 7 information and upon further deliberation the Legislative 8 Council now takes a position supporting transfer of law 9 enforcement functions only to the Department of Justice and 10 supporting the retention of tribal court functions within the 11 **Bureau of Indian Affairs.** 12 13 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative 14 Council, with the advice and consent of the Chairman and the 15 Chief Judge of the Tohono O'odham Nation, that the Position 16 Statement on Law Enforcement in Indian Country in the form 17 attached hereto is adopted as the position of the Tohono 18 O'odham Nation. 19 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that to the extent that the position taken in this 21 **Resolution differs from the position taken in Resolution No. 96-**22 420, this Resolution supercedes Resolution No. 96-420. 23 The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Council on the 24 17TH. day of OCTOBER, 1997 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1.382.5 FOR; 402.5 AGAINST; -0- NOT VOTING; and 142.0 [05] ABSENT. 25 pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section 1(i) of Article VI of the 26 Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'Odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant 27 Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 28 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
