- WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation has been determined eligible for Indian and Native American (INA) Welfare-To-Work funding because it operates a Native Employment Works (NEW) Program: and
- WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation is eligible for Fiscal Year 1998 funding in the amount of \$187,095.00; and
- WHEREAS. the Tohono O'odham Nation has received information from the Arizona Department of Economic Security (ADES) that there are 639 enrolled tribal members receiving cash assistance under Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF); and
- WHEREAS, the majority of these individuals are between the ages of 19-39 years of age, and 59% are long term welfare recipients who have received cash assistance for 12 months or more; and
- WHEREAS, the services provided through the Welfare-To-Work program will provide support and funding to this target group with the goal of assisting in the transition from welfare to work.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that it hereby approves the submittal of the Tohono O'odham Nation Welfare-To-Work plan for fiscal year 1998 by the ITPA/NEW Program.
