RESOLUTION NO. 98-025

WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation with a land base of 2.8 million acres and a population of 19,255 members contracts its own Law Enforcement, Detention and Ranger Program under P. L. 93-638; and

WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation Legislative Council acknowledges that the 638 budget and the Tribal Base Budget is not enough to effect adequate law enforcement; and

WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council responds to the increased demand for law enforcement by supporting the Police Department's request for Tribal dollars in addition to both the 638 base budget and the Tribal Base Budget in the amount of \$3,189,921.00; and

WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation Police Department has employee(s) detailed to fill work assignments which are the responsibility of the positions created in this request for Tribal subsidy; and

WHEREAS, by this resolution the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council authorizes said employee(s) to capture the salary of said positions within guidelines established by the Tohono O'odham Human Resources Policy and Procedure Manual and secure pay retroactive to October 1, 1997 or the date of their assignment if assignment occurred after October 1, 1997; and

WHEREAS, it is understood that the Capital and Renovation & Alteration costs described in this budget request are non-recurring costs and the

other costs associated with this budget request are recurring and will become part of the Base Tribal Budget for future years.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislative Council of the Tohono O'odham Nation authorizes an "off the top" appropriation of Tribal Dollars in the amount of \$3,189,921.00 for Law Enforcement Detention and Ranger Services.


The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Council on the 23RD. day of JANUARY, 1998 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1,348.0 FOR; 450.0 AGAINST; 129.0 NOT VOTING; and [05] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section 1 (d)(2) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'Odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
