WHEREAS,

WHEREAS, on November 7, 1997 Congressman Hastings of Washington introduced H.R. 2893 (the "Hastings Amendment") in the first

session of the 105th Congress to amend the Native American Graves Protection and Repatriation Act, 25 U.S.C. §§ 3001-3013 and 18 U.S.C.

§1170 ("NAGPRA"); and

the Hastings Amendment proposes to amend NAGPRA by removing the ability of tribes to establish ownership of cultural items (defined in NAGPRA to include human remains) excavated on federal or tribal lands based on an adjudicated claim of aboriginal ownership of the land on which the cultural items were found, when cultural affiliation cannot reasonably be ascertained; and

the Hastings Amendment provides for increased opportunity for scientific study of cultural items prior to their return to a culturally affiliated Indian tribe or nation, thereby delaying the repatriation of the cultural items and increasing the number of cultural items which will be studied prior to repatriation; and

WHEREAS, the Hastings Amendment was not reviewed by any Congressional committee during the first session of the 105th Congress but it may be introduced again at any time in the current session of Congress and may be attached to other unrelated legislation as a rider, thereby evading the Congressional committee review process; and WHEREAS, the Cultural Preservation Committee of the Tohono O'odham

10	with Indian tribes.
