

**RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(Approving the submittal of a Pollution Prevention Grant Application
to the EPA)**

RESOLUTION NO. 98-146

WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation ("Nation"), in exercise of its sovereign authority, desires to manage and regulate the storage, collection, recycling, transportation and disposal of solid waste and certain hazardous waste on lands within the boundaries of the Nation in order to protect the Nation's environment, its natural resources, the political integrity and economic security of the Nation, and the health, safety and welfare of its members and all persons present on the lands of the Nation; and

WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council ("Legislative Council") adopted the Solid Waste Management Code and Solid Waste Management Plan on February 12, 1997 and amended the Solid Waste Management Code on October 16, 1997; and

WHEREAS, the Solid Waste Code directs the Solid Waste Management Program to implement a system of collection and disposal of solid waste, including the management of household hazardous waste; and

WHEREAS, for the Solid Waste Management Program to be successful it is very important to educate the O'odham People on the importance of proper disposal of their solid waste and household hazardous waste; and

WHEREAS, the Solid Waste Management Program has prepared a grant proposal requesting \$99,676.00 from the Environmental Protection Agency for a two year period to educate the O'odham People about household hazardous waste, pollution prevention and proper disposal and clean-up; and

WHEREAS, the grant allows for matching funds to be in-kind not actual monies, and the grant does not allow for in-direct cost allocation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council hereby authorizes the submittal of the grant application requesting \$99,676.00 for a pollution prevention program and if successful the authority to accept and to spend such funds in accordance with the grant application scope of work and all policies and procedures set forth by the Council.

The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Council on the 17TH day of APRIL, 1998 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1,813.0 FOR; -0- AGAINST; -0- NOT VOTING; and 114.0 [07] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section 1 (f) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'Odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
