

**RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(Approving a Mutual Protection and Law Enforcement Agreement
with Maricopa County)**

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RESOLUTION NO. 98-175

WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Police Department provides law enforcement services to the Tohono O'odham Nation including San Lucy District; and

WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Police Department has limited resources and manpower to adequately respond to calls from San Lucy District because of the distance between the Police Department's headquarters and San Lucy District; and

WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Police Department has recently opened a substation in the community of North Komelik in Sif Oidak District to improve its response capability in San Lucy District, but this substation is still a long distance from San Lucy District; and

WHEREAS, San Lucy District residents have expressed the need to have law enforcement services capable of readily responding to calls from San Lucy District; and

WHEREAS, representatives of the Tohono O'odham Nation and San Lucy District have negotiated a mutual aid agreement with the Maricopa County Sheriff's Department to further improve law enforcement response time at San Lucy District; and

WHEREAS, San Lucy District, by Resolution No. 03-27-97 dated March 20, 1997 (copy attached hereto), did approve the Mutual Protection and Law Enforcement Agreement ("Agreement") with Maricopa County (copy of the Agreement attached hereto); and

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3 **WHEREAS, the Maricopa County Board of Supervisors did approve the Agreement**
4 **on April 1, 1998; and**

5 **WHEREAS, the Domestic Affairs Committee of the Legislative Council has**
6 **reviewed the Agreement and recommends approval.**

7 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:**

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1. **The Mutual Protection and Law Enforcement Agreement with Maricopa County is approved in the form attached hereto.**
 2. **The Chairman of the Nation is authorized to sign the Agreement on behalf of the Nation.**
 3. **Any proposed termination of the Agreement initiated by the Nation or modification of the Agreement shall require the prior approval of the Legislative Council.**
