

**RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(Authorizing the Chairman of the Tohono O'odham Nation to execute a letter
to the Department of Justice regarding the Judiciary's Grant Fund Application
stating the Nation's commitment to support, operate, and maintain the
Juvenile Detention Facility to be constructed with Grant Funds)**

RESOLUTION NO. 98-256

**WHEREAS, pursuant to the Tohono O'odham Constitution, the Tohono O'odham
Legislative Council has the power to manage any funds within the
control of the Tohono O'odham Nation; and**

**WHEREAS, the Department of Justice, Corrections Programs Office has made
available grant funding for construction of juvenile corrections
facilities on tribal lands; and**

**WHEREAS, twenty-four tribes, including the Tohono O'odham Nation, were served
with notice of the availability of grant funds on April 23, 1998 in a
Grant Application Workshop in Tucson, Arizona. The workshop was
sponsored by the Corrections Programs Office of the United States
Department of Justice; and**

**WHEREAS, the deadline for filing the grant application was set for May 29, 1998
but on May 1, 1998 was extended to June 30, 1998; and**

**WHEREAS, the Judiciary Branch is desirous of applying for grant funding for the
design phase of a new juvenile detention center and completed the
application package necessary for such application on June 25, 1998;
and**

**WHEREAS, the grant application amount is \$1,528,899.00 for the purpose of the
architectural and engineering design of the Planning of New
Institutions (PONI) juvenile detention center.**

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council
hereby authorizes the Nation's Chairman to execute a letter to the**

The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Council on the 29TH day of JUNE, 1998 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1,766.0 FOR; -0- AGAINST; -0- NOT VOTING; and 161.0 [06] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section 1(f) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'Odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).


