

**RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(Supporting H.R. 4119 - "Tohono O'odham Religious Area Restoration
Act of 1998")**

RESOLUTION NO. 98-281

WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation over the past fifteen years requested the return of the Baboquivari Peak and Mountain recognizing the sacred symbol of its people, and as the center of Mother Earth and the dwelling place of I'itoi, our Creator; and

WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council enacted Resolution No. 98-079, respectfully requesting the United States Congress to return 2,065 acres of BLM land which consists of the eastern portion of the Baboquivari Peak to the Tohono O'odham Nation within the 105th Congress; and

WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation held public meetings to hear the concerns of individuals and other organizations on the proposed transfer of land; and

WHEREAS, on June 23, 1998, the Honorable Ed Pastor of the 2nd Congressional District of the State of Arizona, United States House of Representatives, on behalf of the Tohono O'odham Nation introduced H.R. 4119 cited as the "Tohono O'odham Religious Area Restoration Act of 1998."

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council hereby supports the enactment of H.R. 4119, "Tohono O'odham Religious Restoration Act of 1998" in returning to the Tohono O'odham Nation, 2065 acres of land consisting of the eastern portion of the Baboquivari Peak.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Nation is thankful of the efforts of the Honorable Congressman Ed Pastor in introducing the

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that the appropriate officers of the Nation are hereby authorized to present this request to the appropriate members and committees of Congress.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Nation prays to I'itoi, our Creator, that all our efforts are with our Creator's guidance and wisdom.

The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Council on the 08TH day of JULY, 1998 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1,927.0 FOR; -0- AGAINST; -0- NOT VOTING; and [05] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section 1(j) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'Odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
