1 2 RESOLUTION NO. 98-324 3 a portion of the ASARCO Mission Mine is located on allotted lands and WHEREAS. 4 tribal trust lands within San Xavier District of the Tohono O'odham 5 Nation leased to ASARCO by two mining leases dated August 31, 1959 and 6 7 twenty-one business leases dated May 6, 1959 ("Business Lease"), 8 collectively referred to as the leased mine lands; and 9 WHEREAS. the Tohono O'odham Nation ("Nation"), the San Xavier District 10 ("District"), the San Xavier Allottee Association, the Bureau of Land 11 Management ("BLM") and the Bureau of Indian Affairs ("BIA") have 12 engaged in negotiations with ASARCO Incorporated ("ASARCO") over 13 several years to resolve disputes involving that portion of the Mission 14 Mine on Indian lands regarding preparation of a mine plan, bonding 15 levels, dumping of Pima mine tailings, and monitoring of groundwater; 16 and 17 WHEREAS. in the course of these negotiations ASARCO has agreed to perform 18 groundwater monitoring of the aquifer underlying the leased mine lands 19 and surrounding lands under the terms of an Aquifer Protection Permit 20 to be issued by the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality 21 ("ADEQ") under the authority of an Intergovernmental Agreement ("IGA") 22 between the BLM, the BIA, and the ADEQ; and 23 in order to perform such groundwater monitoring ASARCO requires WHEREAS. 24 permission from the Nation to withdraw groundwater at sites agreed to 25 by the Nation, the District, and affected allottee landowners, utilizing **26** two existing wells located within the Business Lease and designated as 27 Well No. AM1 and Well No. AM2 and a new well to be constructed on

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RESOLUTION NO. 98-324 (Approving Agreement Between the Tohono O'odham Nation and ASARCO **Incorporated on Groundwater Monitoring)** 1 Page 2 of 5 2 allotted land outside the Business Lease, as part of a monitoring 3 program specified by a work plan for the development of an Aquifer 4 Protection Permit to be issued by the ADEQ in accordance with the terms 5 of the IGA; and 6 WHEREAS, it is anticipated that additional well sites will be identified in the future 7 and that the Legislative Council will address the issue of groundwater 8 9 withdrawal from additional wells when these sites are identified; and WHEREAS. 10 ASARCO requires the right to rehabilitate and use for monitoring 11 purposes Well No. AM1 located on tribal trust land within the Business 12 Lease in T.16S, R.13E, Section 28ADD; and 13 WHEREAS, Article VI, Section 1(i)(2), of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham 14 Nation gives the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council the authority and 15 responsibility to manage, protect, preserve and regulate the use of the 16 natural resources, including surface and ground waters, of the Tohono 17 O'odham Nation; and 18 WHEREAS, Article XVII of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation provides 19 that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council shall have, consistent with 20 federal law, the control and management of all waters which originate 21 in or flow in, into or through the Tohono O'odham Nation, or which are 22 stored in the Tohono O'odham Nation, whether found on the surface or 23 underground, and that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council shall 24 have the power to determine how these waters shall be developed, used 25 and conserved for the greatest public benefit and to enter into 26 agreements for the beneficial use, sale, or lease or distribution of these 27 waters; and 28

RESOLUTION NO. 98-324 (Approving Agreement Between the Tohono O'odham Nation and ASARCO **Incorporated on Groundwater Monitoring)** 1 Page 3 of 5 2 WHEREAS, the attached Agreement Between the Tohono O'odham Nation and 3 ASARCO Incorporated on Groundwater Monitoring ("Agreement") grants 4 the Nation's permission for ASARCO to use and rehabilitate Well No. AM1 5 and to withdraw groundwater from the two existing wells and one new 6 well under specified conditions; and 7 WHEREAS, the Water Resources Committee and the Natural Resources Committee 8 of the Legislative Council have reviewed the Agreement and recommend 9 that the Legislative Council approve it. 10 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council 11 12 hereby approves the Agreement Between the Tohono O'odham Nation 13 and ASARCO Incorporated on Groundwater Monitoring substantially in 14 the form attached hereto and authorizes the Chairman of the Nation to 15 sign it. 16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the issue of groundwater withdrawal from additional 17 wells will be addressed when additional well sites are identified and are 18 presented to the Legislative Council for approval. 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution and the Agreement approved herein 20 shall have no effect upon the legal rights or legal positions of the Nation, 21 the District, or the allottees of the District in any lawsuits on the issue of 22 ownership of water rights, and shall not be admissible as evidence on 23 such issue in any such lawsuit. 24 The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Council on the <u>06TH</u> 25 day of AUGUST, 1998 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1,927.0 FOR; -0- AGAINST; -0- NOT VOTING; and [04] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in 26 the Council by Section 1(1) & (i)(2) of Article VI and Section 1 & 2 of Article XVII of the Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'Odham Nation 27 on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 28 (48 Stat. 984).
