1 2 3 RESOLUTION NO. 98-378 4 WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 96-233, the Legislative Council authorized payment of 5 the gaming device assessment at an interim annual rate of \$258 per 6 gaming device through June 30, 1998, pending negotiation of the rate in 7 accordance with Section 12 (b) of the Gaming Compact; and 8 WHEREAS, on June 2, 1998, by Resolution No. 98-218, the Legislative Council 9 authorized payment of the gaming device assessment fee at the rate of 10 \$500.00 per gaming device per annum, for one calendar quarter only, 11 commencing July 1, 1998, as a sign of good faith and the Nation's sincere 12 desire to resolve the disputes in litigation through negotiation; and 13 on July 22, 1998 the Director of the Arizona Department of Gaming WHEREAS, 14 terminated settlement negotiations, and the parties returned to litigation 15 upon expiration of the stay entered by the United States District Court 16 Judge; and 17 WHEREAS, on August 3, 1998, the Nation filed a motion in federal court lawsuit for 18 the appointment of a settlement judge; the Nation's motion was granted 19 by the court on August 17, 1998; and 20 WHEREAS, in response to the Nation's August 21, 1998 demand that ADOG perform 21 the joint pre-operation inspection of the Nation's Golden Ha:san Casino, 22 the State renewed settlement negotiations in advance of submission of 23 the matter to the settlement judge; and 24 WHEREAS, representatives of the Nation met with representatives of the State on 25 September 2, 1998, to continue settlement negotiations; and **26** WHEREAS, as a sign of the Nation's continued good faith and sincere desire to resolve 27 the disputes in litigation through negotiation, it is in the Nation's interest 28

to continue payment of the gaming device assessment rate for one quarter at the annualized rate of \$500.00 per gaming device for one additional quarter pending either resolution of the issue through negotiation or returning the matter to litigation for resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

 As a continued sign of good faith and the Nation's sincere desire to resolve the disputes in litigation through negotiation, authorization for payment of the gaming device assessment fee at the rate of \$500.00 per gaming device per annum, is extended for one calendar quarter, commencing October 1, 1998.

- 2. In the event that the dispute over the gaming device assessment rate is not resolved by negotiation by December 1, 1998, the Executive Director of the Gaming Office shall present at the Legislative Council's December 1998 General Legislative Session a recommendation for the amount of the gaming device assessment to be paid in subsequent calender quarters.
- 3. Nothing contained herein shall be interpreted or construed as affecting or limiting the authorization for payment of actual costs incurred by ADOG presented in timely notices from ADOG in accordance with Section 12(b), sentence 7, of the Compact, as provided in Resolution No. 96-233.

The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Council on the 16TH. day of SEPTEMBER, 1998 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1,775.5 FOR; 151.5 AGAINST; -0- NOT VOTING; and (02) ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section 1 (f) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'Odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
