

**RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL  
(Supporting The Grant Application for Funds From The U.S. Department of  
Commerce, National Telecommunications And Information Administration,  
Public Telecommunications Facilities Program)**

**RESOLUTION NO. 99-019**

1 **WHEREAS, since 1979, the members of the Tohono O'odham Nation have expressed an**  
2 **interest in establishing a public fm broadcasting radio station to be run by and**  
3 **for Tohono O'odham; and**

4 **WHEREAS, by Resolution 97-082, the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council approved and**  
5 **adopted the Tohono O'odham Nation Administrative Plan (hereinafter "the Plan")**  
6 **as submitted by the Chairman of the Nation, wherein Section 3-1.1,**  
7 **Communications, identified that the need to establish a radio station "because**  
8 **through radio [the Nation] can readily disseminate public information, legislative**  
9 **sessions, culture and entertainment"; and**

10 **WHEREAS, many reservations throughout the country have a radio station and have found**  
11 **that it is the best way for direct participation in the democratic process; and**

12 **WHEREAS, an O'odham radio station provides an important economic development tool by**  
13 **generating its own income, jobs and informing the public about O'odham**  
14 **businesses.**

15 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council**  
16 **supports the Planning Grant Application for funds available through the U.S.**  
17 **Department of Commerce, National Telecommunications and Information**  
18 **Administration, Public Telecommunications Facilities Program.**

19 **The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Council on the 07TH day of**  
20 **JANUARY, 1999 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1,927.0 FOR; -0-**  
21 **AGAINST; -0- NOT VOTING; and [3] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council**  
22 **by Section 1(f) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, adopted**  
23 **by the Tohono O'Odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy**  
24 **Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of**  
25 **the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).**
