1	WHEREAS,	the O'odham have since time immemorial enjoyed the use of lands which
2		now comprise the Goldwater Range, a vast natural landscape of 2.7
3		million acres, and regard these lands as part of the sacred Papagueria; and
4	WHEREAS,	since 1941, the United States Air Force has used these lands for an aerial
5		bombing and gunnery range to train military aircrews how to attack
6		ground targets or other aircraft as well as how to maneuver, defend
7		themselves and survive in aerial combat; and
8	WHEREAS,	the Air Force's authorization to use the Goldwater Range expires on
9		November 6, 2001 and therefore the Air Force is seeking a renewal of the
10		land withdrawal which withdrew these lands from appropriation and
11		other public uses; and
12	WHEREAS,	the Air Force has released a draft Legislative Environmental Impact
13		Statement ("LEIS") to study the impacts of continued military use of the
14		Goldwater Range as an aerial bombing and gunnery range; and
15	WHEREAS,	the Air Force is preparing an Integrated Cultural Resources Management
16		Plan in Cooperation with the U.S. Bureau of Land Management, the U.S.
17		Fish and Wildlife Service, and the Marine Corps Air Station at Yuma to
18		better preserve and manage the cultural resources on the Goldwater
19		Range; and
20	WHEREAS,	the Air Force has contracted with Dames and Moore to prepare the
21		Integrated Cultural Resources Management Plan; and
22	WHEREAS,	the Air Force has approached the Tohono O'odham Nation (the "Nation")

seeking the Nation's participation in studies of Traditional Cultural 1 Places for use in preparing the Integrated Cultural Resources 2 Management Plan; and 3 WHEREAS, the lands within the Goldwater Range contain sacred sites and 4 Traditional Cultural Places which must be protected from destruction by 5 the Air Force or the general public; and 6 WHEREAS, the Nation wishes to support the effort to protect these sites through 7 development of an integrated Cultural Resources Management Plan while 8 maintaining its strenuous opposition to the continued use of the 9 10 Goldwater Range by the Air Force and especially to any renewal of the land withdrawal for the Air Force; and 11 WHEREAS, the Nation in Resolution No. 98-319 supported participation in Cultural 12 Resources studies within the Goldwater Range and reiterated its 13 opposition to the renewal of the Goldwater Range withdrawal and 14 requested that the lands of the Goldwater Range be set aside as a natural 15 preserve to be administered and managed jointly by the Tohono O'odham 16 17 Nation and the Department of the Interior and ultimately be returned to the title of the Tohono O'odham Nation and be held in trust by the United States for the benefit of the Nation. 19 20

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council:

1. Agrees to enter into a Cooperative Agreement and Statement of Work with Luke Air Force Base as part of an Identification and Evaluation of Traditional Cultural Places and Sacred Sites for the Barry M.

Goldwater Range which are being coordinated by Dames and Moore for the Air Force as part of preparation of an Integrated Cultural Resources Management Plan, on the condition that:

- a) the Air Force provides funding for this project,
- b) the Air Force agrees to protect the sacred sites and Traditional Cultural Properties identified by these studies so long as the Air Force continues its use of the Goldwater Range,
- c) the Nation retains control of all documentation which is produced relating to sacred sites, Traditional Cultural Places and other cultural sites on the Goldwater Range, and that this documentation is not released to the public without the consent of the Nation,
- d) the Nation is invited to participate as a full partner in the implementation of the Integrated Cultural Resources Management Plan,
- e) the Air Force, if it continued to use these lands, will consult with the Nation as a full partner on a government to government basis regarding future uses of the Goldwater Range.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Nation's agreement to participate in this

Traditional Cultural Places and Sacred Sites study and other studies on
the Goldwater Range in order to protect such cultural sites shall in no way
be construed as support for continued Air Force use of the Goldwater
Range.
