

**RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(Supporting Participation in a Participating Agreement with the USDA Forest
Service-Coronado National Forest for the Identification and Evaluation of
Traditional Cultural Places on the Coronado National Forest)**

RESOLUTION NO. 99-072

1 WHEREAS, the O'odham have since time immemorial enjoyed the use of lands which
2 now comprise parts of the Coronado National Forest, and regards these
3 lands as sacred; and

4 WHEREAS, the Indian Claims Commission of 1968 recognized these lands as part of
5 the traditional use lands of the Tohono O'odham; and

6 WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation appreciates the efforts of the Coronado
7 National Forest to interact with the Tohono O'odham Nation on a
8 government to government basis; and

9 WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation appreciates the efforts of the Coronado
10 National Forest to protect Traditional Cultural Places of the Tohono
11 O'odham located on the lands of the Coronado National Forest.

12 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council:

13 1. Agrees to enter into a Participating Agreement with the USDA Forest
14 Service-Coronado National Forest to complete a study that identifies
15 and evaluates Tohono O'odham traditional use areas (Traditional
16 Cultural Places) on the lands of the Coronado National Forest on the
17 condition that:

- 18 a) the USDA Forest Service - Coronado National Forest provides
19 funding for this project,
20 b) the USDA Forest Service - Coronado National Forest agrees to
21 protect the sacred sites and traditional cultural places identified
22 by these studies,

- c) the Tohono O'odham Nation retains control of all documentation which is produced relating to sacred sites, traditional cultural places and other cultural sites on the Coronado National Forest, and this documentation is not released to the public without the consent of the Nation,
- d) the Coronado National Forest will continue to consult on a government to government basis with the Tohono O'odham Nation on the management of cultural and natural resources.


The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Council on the 10TH day of FEBRUARY, 1999 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1,738.0 FOR; -0- AGAINST; -0- NOT VOTING; and 189.0 [04] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section 1 (c)(8), (d)(2), & (f) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'Odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
