

**RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(FY 1999 COPS Budget-Law Enforcement)**

RESOLUTION NO. 99-105

1 WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation with a land area of 2.8 million acres and a
2 population of 23,000 members contracts its own Law Enforcement
3 program; and

4 WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation has been awarded a three year grant from
5 the Department of Justice, Community Oriented Policing Services
6 (COPS); and

7 WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation Police Department acknowledges its
8 responsibilities to find alternate sources of program funding, and has
9 been awarded, for its third year, a COPS Grant budget in the amount of
10 \$149,911.00; and

11 WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation Police Department requests the Legislative
12 Council approve acceptance of this third year budget.

13 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council
14 authorizes the expenditures of this grant and the implementation of the
15 budget where the budget dollar amount is \$149,911.00.

16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the term of the budget is effective December 1, 1998
17 through November 30, 1999.

19 The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Council on the 03RD.
20 day of MARCH, 1999 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1,813.0
21 FOR; -0- AGAINST; -0- NOT VOTING; and 114.0 [10] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers
22 vested in the Council by Section 1 d(2) and (f) of Article VI of the Constitution of the
23 Tohono O'Odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'Odham Nation on January 18, 1986;
24 and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations)
25 on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).




