(Supporting Tohono O'odham Community College FY 2000
Appropriations Request)

RESOLUTION NO. 99-122

1 **WHEREAS, the O'odham Education Department administered a Tohono O'odham**
2 **Nation-wide survey in 1996; and**

3 **WHEREAS, as a result of the Education survey, having a local community college on**
4 **the Tohono O'odham Nation was one of the top priorities; and**

5 **WHEREAS, there exists a need for skilled Tohono O'odham in the disciplines for**
6 **business, health care, law enforcement, environmental protection, science,**
7 **liberal and language arts, education, public policy and government; and**

8 **WHEREAS, the history, culture and tradition of the Tohono O'odham is central to the**
9 **continued existence, sovereignty and self-determination of all Tohono**
10 **O'odham as O'odham and as a Nation; and**

11 **WHEREAS, a college of learning, managed by and for Tohono O'odham, can best**
12 **serve as a center for training and research in those disciplines that may**
13 **define our past, present, and future, while preserving and teaching our**
14 **history, culture, and tradition; and**

15 **WHEREAS, a committee for establishing a community college for the Tohono**
16 **O'odham Nation was formed to collectively pursue this endeavor; and**

17 **WHEREAS, a college charter was written, presented and approved by the Tohono**
18 **O'odham Legislative Council on January 8, 1998, by Resolution No. 98-**
19 **006.**

20 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council**
21 **supports the Tohono O'odham Community College Appropriations**
22 **request and hereby calls upon Congress and the White House to set**

1 funding in the amount of \$18,974,796.20 for a five-year plan, for the
2 operations of the Tohono O'odham Community College.

3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Appropriations Committee are hereby authorized
4 and directed to bring this request to the appropriate agencies, members
5 and committees of Congress.

6 The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Council on the 17TH day
7 of MARCH, 1999 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1,737.0
8 FOR; 0 AGAINST; 0 NOT VOTING; and 190.0 [06] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers
9 vested in the Council by Section 1 (j) Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono
10 O'Odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'Odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and
11 approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on
12 March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
