11		February 12, 1997 and amended the Solid Waste Management Code on
12		October 16, 1997; and
13	WHEREAS,	the Legislative Council has approved both the capital and operating
14		budget for the Solid Waste Management Program and Solid Waste
15

4		PART 258, requires the closing and capping all small rural solid waste
5		dumps, including solid waste dumps on all Indian lands by October 9,
6		1998; and
7	WHEREAS,	the Indian Health Service has developed a preliminary estimate of \$2.4
8		million dollars to close approximately 88 dumps on the Nation's land, and
9		has provided funding to the Nation to further detail the dump closure
10		estimates.
11	NOW, THER	EFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council
12		hereby requests that the United States Congress fund the closure of the
13		88 dumps that have been identified on the Tohono O'odham Nation's
14		land by the Indian Health Service with an appropriation of \$2.4 million
15		dollars in the FY-2000 Federal Budget.
16	BE IT FURTI	HER RESOLVED that the United States Congress fund the unfunded
17		mandate within The Indian Lands Open Dump Clean-up Act of 1994 that
18		requires I.H.S. to finance the closure of all solid waste dumps on Indian
19		lands.
20	BE IT FINAL	LY RESOLVED that the Appropriations Committee are hereby authorized
21		and directed to bring this request to the appropriate agencies, members
22		and committees of Congress.
