## **RESOLUTION NO. <u>99-195</u>**

1	WHEREAS,	the United States Environmental Protection Agency notified the Tohono
2		O'odham Nation through Chairman Edward D. Manuel of a grant award
3		for use in communities that lie within 62 miles of the Tohono O'odham
4		Nation/Mexico border; and
5	WHEREAS,	these funds are limited to use for addressing health and safety concerns
6		related to existing drinking and wastewater issues in these border region
7		communities; and
8	WHEREAS,	the Legislative Council of the Tohono O'odham Nation approved of the
9		communities listed below as those with projects appropriate for
10		submission for funding under the Border Grants Proposal to the United
11		States Environmental Protection Agency:
12		Pia Oik, Gu Vo
13		Gu Vo, Gu Vo
14		Anegam, Sif Oidak
15		Queen's Well, Schuk Toak
16		Little Tucson/Artesia, Baboquivari
17		Sells, Sells

22	WHEREAS,	the Nation accepted the funds contingent on the Nation's obligation to
23		find funds for the construction of bathrooms in the Little Tucson, Artesia,
24		Pia Oik, Cowlic and Gu Vo'o communities; and
25	WHEREAS,	the Nation successfully found HUD funds for the Little Tucson, Artesia
26		and Pia Oik Projects, but still requires funds for Cowlic and Gu Vo'o as
27		well as administration funds to implement the bathrooms construction;

2	WHEREAS,	the Nation and the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) have
3		joined together to provide funds through the Colonias program for the
4		homes that have been inspected and found to be suitable for
5		rehabilitation; and
6	WHEREAS,	the Nation under Resolution 97-263 committed itself to providing funds
7		from Tribal resources if all grant options were exhausted and EPA was
8	·	ready to reclaim the grant funds; and
9	WHEREAS,	the Nation wishes to meet its commitment under Resolution 97-263 and
10		allocate funds to provide for \$93,343.00 for Administration Costs and
11		\$83,725.00 for project costs at Cowlic and \$44,325.00 for project costs at Gu
12		Vo'o to supplement the USDA-provided project funds and to preserve the
13		already awarded EPA wastewater funds.
14	NOW, THE	EREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative
15		Council hereby approves the allocation of Administration and project
16		costs in the amounts of \$93,343.00 for Administration and \$83,725.00 for
17		project costs at Cowlic and \$44,325.00 for project costs at Gu Vo'o.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislative Council of the Tohono O'odham

Nation assures the USDA that it will continue to provide good faith effort

to further rehabilitate the homes receiving USDA funds of \$5,000.00 up

to standard, using other resources both Federal, State, Local and Tribal.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council will

appropriate the amount of \$221,393.00 from the FY 98 savings.
