

**RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(Providing Monetary Donation for the Native American Youth Program)**

RESOLUTION NO. 99-212

1 WHEREAS, the House of Neighborly Service located in the City of South Tucson
2 servicing the needs of its community; and

3 WHEREAS, the Native American Youth Program is a component of the House of
4 Neighborly Service; and

5 WHEREAS, the Native American Youth Program consists of program coordinators,
6 parent volunteers, and youth ranging from 5 to 19 years of age; and

7 WHEREAS, the Native American Youth Program is a non-profit organization seeking
8 funds through grants, private contributions and fund raising activities by
9 its members; and

10 WHEREAS, the Native American Youth Program's goal is to promote activities that are
11 culturally relevant and express self identification; and

12 WHEREAS, presentations have been made by spiritual leaders and tribal members of
13 traditional beliefs and practices to introduce the youth to their O'odham
14 heritage; and

15 WHEREAS, many Tohono O'odham youth have grown up within the city, with family
16 ties to the Tohono O'odham Nation, however not fully aware of their
17 culture beliefs or traditions; and

18 WHEREAS, the Native American Youth Program's mission is to educate the youth to
19 better understand the importance and richness of their culture and show
20 respect for themselves and others within traditional ways; and

21 WHEREAS, most of the youth are from families with low or no income at all; and

1 WHEREAS, the Native American Youth Program has had numerous food sales to raise
2 money for a trip to Universal Studios in California; and

3 WHEREAS, a donation from the Nation will make it possible for the youth to go on its
4 fun trip to California in May 1999.

5 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council
6 hereby approves a monetary donation for the Native American youth
7 Program in the amount of \$2,000 to be allocated from the 1999 General
8 Revenue Fund.

10 The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Council on the 06TH day
11 of MAY, 1999 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1,317.0 FOR;
12 464.0 AGAINST; 146.0 NOT VOTING; and [02] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested
13 in the Council by Section 1 (d)(2) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono
14 O'Odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'Odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and
15 approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on
16 March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
