

**RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL  
(Approving the Nation to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding with Pro  
Neighborhoods to release funds for the Tohono O'odham Youth Services)**

**RESOLUTION NO. 99-551**

1 **WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation is presently operating the Tohono O'odham Youth**  
2 **Services (Youth Services) Program under an agreement with United Way of**  
3 **Tucson to have Pro Neighborhoods serve as an intermediate between the Nation**  
4 **and United way; and**

5 **WHEREAS, the purpose and goals of the Youth Services is to promote and encourage**  
6 **education, physical fitness, cultural enrichment and overall personal**  
7 **development for and among Tohono O'odham youth; and**

8 **WHEREAS, the Memorandum of Understanding submitted by Pro-Neighborhoods**  
9 **specifically refers to the amount of \$4,107.00 which is the final allocation of the**  
10 **three year funding cycle 1997-2000; and**

11 **WHEREAS the Memorandum of Understanding has been reviewed and approved by Grants**  
12 **& Contracts and the Executive Branch legal counsel; and**

13 **WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council adopted Resolution No. 99-442**  
14 **approving the Youth Services FY 1999-2000 United Way budget indicating the**  
15 **service allocation amount of \$4,107.00; and**

16 **WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation must submit the Memorandum of Understanding**  
17 **before funds are released to the Youth Services; and**

18 **WHEREAS, in addition to these Pro Neighborhood funds, United Way has agreed to provide**  
19 **the sum of \$10,989.00 for related Youth Services.**

20 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council agrees**  
21 **to the terms and conditions of the Memorandum of Understanding between the**  
22 **Tohono O'odham Nation -Tohono O'odham Youth Services and Pro-**  
23 **Neighborhoods.**

24 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman of the Nation is authorized to enter into**

1 agreement with Pro Neighborhoods and to receive the sum of \$4,107.00 directly  
2 from from Pro Neighborhood and the sum of \$10,989.00 from United Way to be  
3 expended through the Tohono O'odham Youth Services program, consistent  
4 with established policies and procedures.

5 The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Council on the 30TH day of  
6 SEPTEMBER, 1999 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 2,101.45 FOR;  
7 -0- AGAINST; 64.05 NOT VOTING; and [04] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the  
8 Council by Section 1 (f) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham Nation,  
9 adopted by the Tohono O'Odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting  
10 Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to  
11 Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
