RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

(To Make an Offer to Purchase Certain Property from the Gila Bend Investment Group, Ltd., and/or to Request Waiver by the Secretary of the Interior of Certain **Provisions of Public Law 99-503)**

RESOLUTION NO. 99-623

1	WILKEAS,	San Lucy District, a political subdivision of the Tohono O'odham Nation, was
2		aggrieved by the United States of America by actions of the U.S. Army Corps of
3		Engineers in the design and construction of the Painted Rock Dam which
4		resulted in habitual flooding of Gila Bend Indian Reservation Lands and
5		rendered these lands unsuitable for habitation and economic development; and
6	WHEREAS,	on October 20, 1986, the United States Congress enacted the Gila Bend Indian
7		Reservation Lands Replacement Act, Public Law 99-503 (the "Replacement Act"),
8		after the Gila Bend Indian Reservation (San Lucy) was destroyed by repeated
9		${\bf flooding caused by the United States' construction of the Painted Rock Dam. The}$
10		Replacement Act authorized the Tohono O'odham Nation ("Nation") to purchase
11		up to 9,880 acres of private lands in Pima, Pinal or Maricopa Counties as
12		replacement reservation lands and provided funds for the replacement of
13		damaged lands with lands suitable for sustained economic use; and
14	WHEREAS,	the Replacement Act recognized that the "lack of an appropriate land base
15		severely retards the economic self-sufficiency of the O'odham people of the Gila
16		Bend Indian Reservation, contributes to their high unemployment and acute
17		$\textbf{health problems} \ldots ", \textbf{and authorized payment to the Nation of the sum of Thirty}$
18		${\bf Million\ Dollars\ (\$30,000,000)\ "to\ be\ used\ for\ the\ benefit\ of\ the\ San\ Lucy\ District";}$
19		and
20	WHEREAS,	the Replacement Act provides that all funds derived from the Act, as well as any
21		and all interest pertaining to such funds, may be spent by the Nation "on behalf
22		of the San Lucy District for land and water rights acquisition, economic and
23		community development, and relocation costs"; and
24	WHEREAS,	section 6(c) of the Replacement Act authorizes the Nation to acquire by purchase
25		lands of up to 9,880 acres as replacement lands. Under section 6(d), the Secretary
26		of the Interior is instructed to hold in trust any replacement lands which satisfy

specific criteria set forth in the Replacement Act. Section 6(d) provides:

The Secretary, at the request of the Tribe, shall hold in trust for the benefit of the Tribe any land which the Tribe acquires pursuant to subsection (c) which meets the requirements of this subsection. Any land which the Secretary holds in trust shall be deemed to be a Federal Indian Reservation for all purposes. Land does not meet the requirements of this subsection if it is outside the counties of Maricopa, Pinal, and Pima, Arizona, or within the corporate limits of any city or town. Land meets the requirements of this subsection only if it constitutes not more than three separate areas consisting of contiguous tracts, at least one of which areas shall be contiguous to San Lucy Village. The Secretary may waive the requirements set forth in the preceding sentence if he determines that additional areas are appropriate.

and

WHEREAS, Article IX, section 5 of the Tohono O'odham Constitution provides:

Each district shall govern itself in matters of local concern, except that in any matter involving more than one district in which there is a dispute, the Tohono O'odham Council shall decide the matter.

and

WHEREAS, a task force comprised of members of San Lucy District was created to consider options and usage of the Replacement Act funds for economic and community development for San Lucy District. San Lucy Village currently consists of forty (40) acres and, as of the date hereof, all housing in San Lucy has been assigned. There is no additional land available for housing in San Lucy and it is in dire need of additional land on which to construct housing for its members; and WHEREAS, the task force recommended to the District Council the purchase of 1,181.14 acres located west of and contiguous to the current 40 acre San Lucy Village and

acres located west of and contiguous to the current 40 acre San Lucy Village and currently owned by the Gila Bend Investment Group, Ltd. as replacement lands to be held in trust, which property is more specifically described as Sections 25 and 26, Township 5 South, Range 5 West, County of Maricopa, State of Arizona;

WHEREAS, after recommendation by the task force, Resolution No. S.L. 09-86-99 was passed 1 2 whereby the San Lucy District Council requested that, pursuant to the 3 Replacement Act, the Nation make a formal offer to Gila Bend Investment Group, 4 Ltd. to purchase 1,181.14 acres, Section 25 and 26, Township 5 South, Range 5 5 West, Maricopa County (the "Property") at the purchase price of \$675 per acre for 6 a total offer of \$797,269.50. A copy of Resolution No. S.L. 09-86-99 is attached 7 hereto as Exhibit "A"; and 8 WHEREAS, San Lucy District determined that, other than the above referenced Property, 9 there are no other lands which are contiguous to San Lucy Village that are 10 available for purchase at this time. Further, San Lucy District, through its task 11 force and with the assistance of the Nation's land specialists, determined that the 12 parcels of lands available for purchase in Maricopa, Pima or Pinal County are 13 not large enough in acreage to accomplish the purchase of replacement land of 14 up to 9,880 acres through three (3) separate areas of contiguous tracts as 15 provided for under section 6(d) of the Replacement Act. As a result, San Lucy 16 District determined that in order to acquire replacement lands of up to 9,880 17 acres, it is necessary to request the Secretary of the Interior to waive the 18 requirement that one of the areas be contiguous to San Lucy Village and waive 19 the limitation that the parcels consist of three (3) separate areas consisting of 20 contiguous tracts and modify the provision to provide for the purchase of up to 21 five (5) separate areas consisting of contiguous tracts; and 22 WHEREAS, San Lucy District determined that if, as anticipated for reasons set forth in Resolution No. S.L. 10-96-99, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "B" and 23 incorporated herein by reference, Gila Bend Investment Group, Ltd. rejects the 24 25 Nation's offer to purchase the Property, then it is not in San Lucy District's best 26 interests to delay the request for a waiver from the Secretary of the Interior; and || WHEREAS, by Resolution No. S.L. 10-96-99, San Lucy District requested, pursuant to the 27

Replacement Act, that in the event that the Nation's offer to purchase the 1 Property is rejected by the Gila Bend Investment Group, Ltd., that the Nation 2 3 promptly request a waiver from the Secretary of the Interior of those provisions 4 of section 6(d) of the Replacement Act that require that one of the areas of 5 replacement lands be located contiguous to San Lucy Village and waive the 6 limitation that the parcels consist of three (3) separate areas consisting of 7 contiguous tracts and modify the latter provision to provide for the purchase of 8 up to five (5) separate areas consisting of contiguous tracts; and 9 WHEREAS,it is in the best interests of San Lucy District and the Nation to have the current 10 Administration of the United States Executive Branch, including the current 11 Secretary of the Interior, consider any waiver request; and WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council agrees that San Lucy District's 12 13 recommendations and requests as set forth in Resolution Nos. 09-86-99 and 10-14 96-99 are consistent with the purpose and directive of federal law as set forth in 15 the Replacement Act; and 16 WHEREAS,the Natural Resources Committee, the Investment Committee, the Budget and 17 Finance Committee, and the Appropriations Committee of the Legislative 18 Council have reviewed this resolution and recommend that it be approved. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council 19 20 does hereby agree to the following: 21 1. The Nation will make a formal offer to Gila Bend Investment Group, Ltd. to purchase approximately 1,181.14 acres in Sections 25 and 26, Township 5 22 23 South, Range 5 West, Maricopa County at the purchase price of \$675 per acre 24 for a total offer of \$797,269.50. The Nation will make the offer by December 25 1, 1999 and the offer shall be open for a period of ten (10) business days from 26 the date of hand delivery of the offer, at which time, if a written acceptance

of the offer has not been received, the offer will expire automatically.

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- 2. In the event that the Nation's offer is rejected by the Gila Bend Investment Group, Ltd., and pursuant to the request of San Lucy District in Resolution No. S.L. 10-96-99 referred to above, the Chairman of the Nation with the Appropriations Committee of the Legislative Council will promptly request that the Secretary of the Interior waive the provision of section 6(d) of the Replacement Act that requires that one (1) of the areas of replacement lands be located contiguous to San Lucy Village.
- 3. Pursuant to the request of San Lucy District in Resolution No. S.L. 10-96-99 referred to above, the Chairman of the Nation with the Appropriations Committee of the Legislative Council will promptly request that the Secretary of the Interior waive the limitation in section 6(d) of the Replacement Act that the parcels consist of three (3) separate areas consisting of contiguous tracts and request that this provision be modified to provide for the purchase of up to five (5) separate areas consisting of contiguous tracts.

The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Council on the 17TH. day of NOVEMBER. 1999 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 2.165.5 FOR; -0-AGAINST; -0-NOT VOTING; and [07] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section 1 (i)(3) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'Odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
