1	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Nation filed a lawsuit against the United States Departments of
2	:	the Interior and Treasury and the Office of the Special Trustee for American Indians
3		in December 2006 in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia
4		styled Tohono O'odham Nation v. Dirk Kempthorne, Ross O. Swimmer, and Henry M
5		Paulson, Case Number 1:06CV02236; and
6	WHEREAS,	after litigation of the case for several years the Nation joined with other tribes and
7		entered into settlement discussions with officials of the Obama administration; and
8	WHEREAS,	in December 2011 the United States made an initial offer of settlement to the Nation,
9		and the attorneys for the parties, after additional exchange of proposals, have now
10		concluded their settlement discussions as to the amount of the settlement; and
11	WHEREAS,	the language of the draft settlement agreement has been agreed to except for
12		paragraph 6(b), where the Nation has proposed additional language; and
13	WHEREAS,	the Trust Settlement Delegation of the Nation has conferred with the Nation's

20		in the complaint filed in the lawsuit;
21		2. Agrees to dismiss the lawsuit under the terms described in the draft Joint
22		Stipulation and approves the Joint Stipulation substantially in the form attached
23		hereto, with the wording of paragraph 6(b) as follows:
24		"6(b). Plaintiff's water rights, whether adjudicated or unadjudicated; Plaintiff's
25		authority to use and protect such water rights; and Plaintiff's claims for damages
26		for loss of water resources (including related infrastructure and crops) allegedly
27		caused by Defendants' failure to establish, acquire, enforce or protect such water
28		rights", and with the understanding that minor nonsubstantive changes in the
29		wording of the Joint Stipulation may still be made by the attorneys for the parties;

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1	3. Authorizes the attorneys for the Nation, namely the Kilpatrick Stockton and
2	Townsend law firm, to execute the Joint Stipulation on behalf of the Nation and to bind
3	the Nation to its terms.
4	The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council on the 29 TH Day
5 6	of <u>FEBRUARY</u> , 2012 a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of <u>2,780.60</u> FOR; <u>-0-</u>
7	AGAINST; <u>-0-</u> NOT VOTING; and <u>[03]</u> ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section 1 (f) and (j) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono
8	O'odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary -
9	Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48
10	Stat. 984).
