Selected contractor for permanent campus construction and construction began for first permanent campus College buildings to be completed by April 2012. Provided grant-funded scholarships for four TOCC employees to obtain master's degrees in Educational Leadership, and 10 TOCC employees to pursue associate and bachelor's degrees. Increased staff and faculty retention during the last three years to 90%. Re-established dual enrollment for Baboquivari and Tohono O'odham High School students with scholarships. Reduced outside consulting through establishing internal full-time key positions in accounting and data systems management. Increased outreach to Nation's entities to provide requested courses and to 15 increase enrollment, with a fall 2011 unduplicated enrollment of 296 as of September 30, 2011 with more high school students projected for dual enrollment for this semester. Received a \$5,000,000 Title III grant to facilitate student retention and for capital construction. TOCC website updated and website and emails changed to tocc.edu. Presidential search completed with hiring of James Vander Hooven, Ed.D. who began October 31, 2011; and WHEREAS, the College has set the following priorities: Meet the requirements for continued accreditation by North Central Higher Learning Commission by improving strategic planning, and institutional assessment: Meet the requirements for continued accreditation by the North Central Higher Learning Commission by completing first phase of construction of permanent campus; Continue to increase student enrollment and retention; Continue to seek funding for full build out of permanent campus to include a

cafeteria, gym, and more residential housing:
