

RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(Supporting the Reauthorization of the Special Diabetes Program for Indians at
\$200 Million Per Year for Five Years)

RESOLUTION NO. 12-296

1 **WHEREAS, the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation vests the Legislative Council with the**
2 **authority "to promote, protect and provide for public health, peace, morals, education**
3 **and general welfare of the Tohono O'odham Nation and its members. . ." and with the**
4 **authority to "consult with the Congress of the United States and appropriate federal**
5 **agencies regarding federal activities that affect the Tohono O'odham Nation..."**
6 **(Constitution, Article VI, Section 1(c)(2) and Section 1(j)); and**

7 **WHEREAS, in the Balanced Budget Act of 1997, Congress enacted legislation creating the Special**
8 **Diabetes Program for Indians ("SDPI") to treat and prevent diabetes in American**
9 **Indians and Alaska Natives; and**

10 **WHEREAS, since 1997, the Nation's Department of Health and Human Services has developed**
11 **programs to incorporate diabetes risk prevention as a part of a healthy lifestyle,**
12 **actively sought after SDPI grant funds to prevent diabetes, build infrastructure, and**
13 **train staff to change the health behavior of the Nation's members (Resolution No. 98-**
14 **149, Resolution No. 2000-182); and**

15 **WHEREAS, the Nation has urged Congress and supported the National Congress of American**
16 **Indians' previous efforts to renew SDPI funding (Resolution No. 02-148 and Resolution**
17 **No. 02-245); and**

18 **WHEREAS, the current SDPI appropriation, Public Law 110-275, at \$150 million per year expires**
19 **FY 2013; and**

20 **WHEREAS, the Nation's members greatly benefit from the Healthy O'odham Promotion Program**
21 **and SDPI funding and the need for diabetes education and prevention remain; and**

22 **WHEREAS, the Health and Human Services Committee recommends advocating for the**
23 **reauthorization of the SDPI at \$200 million per year for the next five years.**

24 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that it supports**
25 **the reauthorization of the SDPI at \$200 million per year for the next five years.**

26 **BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that the Nation's**
27 **chairperson or official designee is authorized and directed to advocate the Nation's**
28 **support for SDPI reauthorization at \$200 million per year for the next five years.**
