RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL (Granting Limited Right to Access Nation's Lands for Shadow Wolves Documentary)

	RESOLUTION NO. <u>12-333</u>
1	WHEREAS, the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation provides that:
2	The unallotted lands of the Tohono O'odham Nation and all lands hereafte
3	acquired by the nation, or held for the use of the nation or its members, are a
4	valuable public resource and shall be held as national lands forever. Control and
5	management thereofare vested in the Tohono O'odham Council, which may enac
6	laws governing the use, assignment, permit, lease or other disposition of lands
7	interests in land and resources of the nation consistent with Federal law.
8	(Constitution, Article XVI, Section 1); and
9	WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation exercises jurisdiction over its lands and has enacted the
10	Tohono O'odham Agricultural and Range Resource Management Trespass Ordinance
11	(Ordinance No. 03-01), the Removal and Exclusion of Non-Members Ordinance
12	(Ordinance No. 97-02), and other laws to restrict and condition access to the Nation's
13	lands (19 T.O.C. Chapter 1 and 4 T.O.C. Chapter 2); and
14	WHEREAS, in 1974, the then U.S. Customs Service began the Shadow Wolves Program comprised
15	of Native American customs patrol officers known for their ability to track alien and
16	drug smugglers mainly relying on traditional methods of tracking to comba
17	smuggling on the Tohono O'odham Nation (Immigration and Customs Enforcemen
18	Fact Sheet: Shadow Wolves, available a
19	http://www.ice.gov/news/library/factsheets/shadow-wolves.htm); and
20	WHEREAS, the Shadow Wolves Program, currently a part of the U.S. Department of Homeland
21	Security Immigration and Customs Enforcement, is the only program of its kinds in
22	the United States incorporating the traditional methods of Native Americans to
23	implement federal border policies; and
24	WHEREAS, the Heard Museum and documentary filmmaker Ty Kim have approached and
25	requested the Nation's permission to produce a documentary of the Shadow Wolve
26	on the Tohono O'odham Nation's lands; and
27	WHEREAS, the Heard Museum and Mr. Kim have obtained permission from the United State
28	Department of Homeland Security and the Immigration and Customs Enforcemen
29	Shadow Wolves to film the documentary, which the Heard Museum will use exclusivel

for educational and non-commercial purposes; and

1	WHEREAS, Mr. Kim and the Heard Museum (hereafter, "Documentary Producers") have agree
2	to provide internships to two enrolled Nation's members to assist in the making of th
3	documentary film; and
4	WHEREAS, the Documentary Producers have agreed to coordinate with the Nation's Cultura
5	Center and Museum, Cultural Affairs Office, and Nation's Education Departmen
6	before and after completing the documentary in order to maximize the film's benefit
7	to all Nation's members; and
8	WHEREAS, the Domestic Affairs and Cultural Preservation Committees have reviewed th
9	proposal and recommend that the Legislative Council grant a limited right to th
10	Documentary Producers to access the Nation's lands for filming the Shadow Wolve
11	documentary.
12	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Legislative Council that it hereby grants th
13	Documentary Producers and any necessary crew or personnel a limited right to acces
14	the Nation's lands to film a non-commercial documentary of the Shadow Wolve
15	subject to the following conditions:
16	1. Prior to filming, the Documentary Producers shall provide the Nation's chairma
17	with a list of the names of necessary crew and other personnel;
18	2. Prior to filming in any district, the Documentary Producers shall notify the distric
19	chairperson and vice-chairperson;
20	3. Documentary Producers and necessary crew or personnel shall be respectful of
21	the Nation's members and way of life;
22	4. Documentary Producers and necessary crew or personnel shall respect th
23	Nation's lands by not destroying vegetation, littering, or otherwise degrading th
24	Nation's lands and will make efforts to minimize any impacts to the Nation
25	environmental resources;
26	5. Documentary Producers will consult with the Nation's Cultural Affairs Office t
27	avoid damage to cultural sites or interruption of traditional ceremonies of
28	celebrations;
29	6. The Tohono O'odham Nation's official position on border issues and other matter
30	related to the documentary will be presented solely by the Nation's elected official

1	or by Nation's staff designed by the Nation's chairperson or Domestic Affairs
2	Committee; and
3	7. Documentary Producers shall coordinate with the Nation's Cultural Center and
4	Museum and the Nation's Education Department to identify at least two enrolled
5	members of the Nation who will be offered internships and participate in the
6	project; and
7	8. Documentary Producers will offer the Nation's Cultural Center and Museum the
8	right and opportunity to show the Shadow Wolves documentary without cost to the
9	Cultural Center and Museum.
10	BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED by the Legislative Council that the limited right to access granted by this
11	resolution shall expire on March 1, 2013.
