16		relief for claims against the United States; and
17	WHEREAS,	the proposal currently being considered by the Administrative Conference of the
18		United States seeks to remedy the inequities wrought upon plaintiffs by the Court's
19		interpretation of 28 U.S.C. § 1500 in <i>United States v. Tohono O'odham Nation</i> ; and
20	WHEREAS,	the Trust Settlement Delegation has reviewed and recommends that the Legislative
21		Council approve comments in favor of the proposal to repeal and revise 28 U.S.C. §
22		1500, which comments are attached hereto and incorporated by reference.
23	NOW, THER	EFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council adopts the Tohono
24		O'odham Nation's comments on the proposal to repeal and revise 28 U.S.C. § 1500 in
25		substantially the form attached hereto and authorizes and directs the Nation's
26		Chairperson to timely submit the Nation's comments to the United States Department
27		of Justice and the Administrative Conference of the United States.
