## RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

(Urging Governor Janice K. Brewer to Expand the Arizona Health Care Cost Containment System in Accordance with the Affordable Care Act)

RESOLUTION NO. 12-458

1	WHEREAS,	$the \ Constitution\ of\ the\ Tohono\ O'odham\ Nation\ vests\ the\ Legislative\ Council\ with\ the$
2		authority ``top romote, protect and provide for public health, peace, morals, education
3		and general welfare of the Tohono O'odham Nation and its members" and "to
4		consult, negotiate and conclude agreements and contracts on behalf of the Tohono
5		O'odham Nation with Federal, State and local governments" (Constitution, Article
6		VI, Section 1(c)(2) and Section 1(f)); and
7	WHEREAS,	the Affordable Care Act, enacted on March 23, 2010, is a major piece of federal
8		legislation directed at comprehensive health insurance reforms with several
9		provisions affecting the Tohono O'odham Nation and its members, including the
10		permanent reauthorization of the Indian Health Care Improvement Act and the
11		expansion of Medicaid eligibility, beginning January, 2014, to all individuals under
12		133% of the federal poverty level (Public Law 111-148, 124 Stat. 119); and
13	WHEREAS,	immediately after President Barack Obama signed the Affordable Care Act into law,
14		twenty-six states, including Arizona, joined in a constitutional challenge of the
15		${\bf Affor dable\ Care\ Act's\ requirement\ that\ every}$
16		individual maintain minimum health insurance coverage (i.e. "minimum coverage
17		provision"); and
18	WHEREAS,	in previous resolutions, the Legislative Council expressed its position in the
19		$constitutionality\ of\ the\ Affordable\ Care\ Act\ as\ whole\ but\ also\ authorized\ the\ Nation's$
20		participation as an $\it amicus$ in the National Indian Health Board's $\it amici$ $\it curiae$ brief
21		in States of Florida, et al. v. Department of Health and Human Services, et al. to argue
22		the  severability  of  the  Indian  Health  Care  Improvement  Act  in  the  event  the  Supreme
23		Court of the United States invalidated portions of the Affordable Care Act; and
24	WHEREAS,	on June 28, 2012, the Supreme Court of the United States issued its opinion in <i>States</i>
25		of Florida, et al. v. Department of Health and Human Services, et al. upholding the
26		$constitutional ity of all \ the \ provisions \ of \ the \ Affordable \ Care \ Act \ with \ the \ exception \ of \ all $
27		the Medicaid expansion; and
28	WHEREAS,	in its opinion, the Supreme Court  held  that  the  Medicaid  expansion  unconstitutionally
29		infringed upon state's rights and therefore states had the option to adopt the Medicaid
30		expansion or not without threat of losing all of the state's Medicaid federal funds; and

Brewer hasn't expressed intent whether Arizona will 1 expand Arizona's Medicaid, the Arizona Health Care Cost Containment System 2 3 ("AHCCCS"), to include all individuals under 133% of the federal poverty level; and 4 WHEREAS, prior to June, 2011, Arizona's AHCCCS eligibility and services were far more expansive 5 and benefited non-disabled childless adults and other services utilized by members 6 of the Nation, but in an effort to balance the State's budget, Arizona requested and 7 received a Demonstration Waiver which excluded previously eligible childless adults; 8 and 9 WHEREAS, the Legislative Council opposed all proposed provisions in the Demonstration Waiver 10 which would eliminate eligibility or reduce services greatly needed by the Nation's 11 members and other tribal members in Arizona (Legislative Council Resolution No. 11-12 278); and 13 WHEREAS, the Medicaid expansion under the Affordable Care Act would restore eligibility to 14 many of the Nation's members and benefit other Arizona citizens and it is in the best 15 interest of the Nation's members to advocate for its expansion; and 16 WHEREAS, under the Medicaid expansion, states receive a 100% federal medical assistance **17** percentage ("FMAP") to cover the costs of expanding eligibility to those individuals who were previously ineligible under the state's Medicaid plan, but because Arizona 18 19 previously offered greater Medicaid eligibility than other states, including childless 20 adults, the federal government will not reimburse the state at the 100% FMAP coverage 21 for childless adults; and 22 WHEREAS, it would be in the Nation's best interest to join AHCCCS and advocate for an enhanced 23 federal medical assistance percentage to cover childless adults; and 24 WHEREAS, the Legislative Health and Human Services Committee recommends joining other 25 Arizona tribes in urging Governor Janice K. Brewer to accept the federal matching funds and expand Arizona's Medicaid, AHCCCS, to include all individuals under 133% 26 27 of the federal poverty level and to advocate for the enhanced FMAP to cover childless adults. 28 29 30

1	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that it urges
2	Governor Janice K. Brewer to accept the federal matching funds and expand Arizona's
3	Medicaid, AHCCCS, to include all individuals under 133% of the federal poverty level.
4	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that it urges the Centers
5	for Medicaid and Medicare to approve AHCCCS' request for enhanced FMAP at 83%-
6	90% for childless adults.
7	BEIT FINALLY RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that it authorizes and directs
8	the Nation's chairperson or authorized delegate to advocate for the expansion of
9	AHCCCS and enhanced FMAP in accordance with this resolution.
10	The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council on the <u>09<sup>TH</sup></u> Day
11	of NOVEMBER, 2012 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 2,568.70 FOR; -0-
12	AGAINST; <u>-0-</u> NOT VOTING; and <u>211.90[07]</u> ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council
13 14	by Article VI, Section 1 <u>(c)(2) and (f)</u> of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant
15	Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June
16	18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
