RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

(Appointing Nation's Negotiating Team for a Comprehensive Water Rights Settlement)

RESOLUTION NO. 12-460

1	WHEREAS,	the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation provides that "[a]ll waters which
2		originate in or flow in, into or through the Tohono O'odham Nation, or which are
3		stored in the Tohono O'odham Nation, whether found on the surface or underground,
4		are a valuable public resource of the Tohono O'odham Nation" and vests the
5		Legislative Council with "control and management of these waters" (Constitution,
6		Article XVII, Sections 1 and 2); and
7	WHEREAS,	$the\ Constitution\ of\ the\ Tohono\ O'odham\ Nation\ further\ vests\ the\ Legislative\ Council$
8		$with \ the \ authority \ to \ ``consult \ with \ the \ Congress \ of the \ United \ States \ and \ appropriate$
9		$federal\ agencies\ regarding\ federal\ activities\ that\ affect\ the\ Tohono\ O'odham\ Nation.$
10		"(Constitution, Article VI, Section 1(j)); and
11	WHEREAS,	since 1994 the Tohono O'odham Nation has sought the appointment of a federal
12		negotiating team to negotiate a settlement to the Nation's Sif Oidak water claims
13		(Resolution No. 94-014); and
14	WHEREAS,	in 1998 the Department of the Interior appointed a Federal Assessment Working
15		Group to determine whether establishment of a Federal Negotiating Team was
16		warranted; and
17	WHEREAS,	by Resolution No. 99-244, the Nation established the Nation's Negotiating Team for the Nation's Negotiating Negot
18		Sif Oidak Water Claims, consisting of the Water Resources Committee of the
19		Legislative Council, the Chairman of the Nation, and a representative and alternate
20		from the Sif Oidak District; and
21	WHEREAS,	in 2008 the Water Resources Committee met with representatives of districts within
22		the Gila River Adjudication boundary, namely Sif Oidak, Gu Achi, Schuk Toak,
23		$Hickiwan, Sells, and \ Gu\ Vo\ Districts, to\ discuss\ how to\ proceed\ with\ negotiating\ the\ Siff$
24		Oidak Water Claims; and
25	WHEREAS,	by Resolution No. 09-095, the Nation approved a settlement proposal for the Sif Oidak
26		$Water\ Claims\ which\ was\ submitted\ to\ Secretary\ of\ the\ Interior\ Ken\ Salazar\ on\ April\ 8,$
27		2009, and also agreed that the Sif Oidak Water Claims would be defined as claims
28		${\bf arising from the Nation's lands and waters within Sif Oidak District alone, and that Sif Oidak District alone, and District Alone, Al$
29		OidakDistrictberepresentedontheNation'snegotiatingteamfortheSifOidakWaterAllered and Allered are also also also also also also also also

31	WHEREAS,	by letter dated July 6, 2011, the Department of the Interior informed the Nation that,
32		in accordance with the Nation's numerous requests, the Department of the Interior

RESOLUTION NO. 12-460 (Appointing Nation's Negotiating Team for a Comprehensive Water Rights Settlement) Page 2 of 4 would appoint a Federal Indian Water Rights Negotiating Team to assist in settling the 1 2 Nation's water rights claims, on the condition that the negotiation is a comprehensive 3 negotiation of the Nation's remaining water rights claims in the State of Arizona; and 4 WHEREAS, such a comprehensive negotiation would include lands of the Nation whose surface 5 waters flow into Mexico rather than into the Gila River basin, and could potentially involve claims against the United States related to groundwater pumping in Mexico 6 7 close to the Nation's boundary; and 8 WHEREAS, by letter dated August 11, 2011, the Nation expressed its concerns to the Department 9 of the Interior about expanding the negotiation process to include claims arising from all lands of the Nation except for eastern Schuk Toak and San Xavier Districts whose 10 11 claims were settled in the SAWRSA amended settlement of 2004, the primary concern 12 being the delay that would result from involving ten districts rather than one district 13 in the negotiation process; and WHEREAS, in a meeting on November 29, 2011, the Nation's negotiating team and the Federal 14 15 negotiating team agreed that issues involving groundwater pumping in Mexico or surface waters flowing into and from Mexico would be excluded from the current 16 negotiation, and that issues involving the original Sif Oidak Water Claims could be 17 18 negotiated and resolved while issues involving water resources of the Nation within 19 the remaining nine districts were being researched and discussed; and WHEREAS, the Nation's comprehensive water settlement negotiation must be concluded as 20 quickly as possible because other Arizona Indian tribes are also negotiating for a 21 limited amount of CAP water and limited federal funds available for Arizona Indian 22 water settlements under the provisions of the Arizona Water Settlements Act; and 23 WHEREAS, the Legislative Water Resources Committee and Nation's Chairperson have been 24 authorized by Resolution No. 12-030 to negotiate contracts or other agreements for the 25 26 Nation's SAWRSA CAP water; and WHEREAS, the Water Resources Committee recommends that the comprehensive settlement for 27 the Nation's water resources, as proposed by the Department of the Interior, should 28 be negotiated on the Nation's behalf by the Legislative Water Resources Committee 29 and the Nation's Chairperson or, in the Chairperson's absence, the Nation's Vice-30 31 Chairperson. 32

1	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council appoints the
2	Legislative Water Resources Committee and the Nation's Chairperson or, in the
3	Chairperson's absence, the Nation's Vice-Chairperson as the Nation's negotiating
4	team for a comprehensive water claims settlement; provided that the negotiating
5	team appointed by this resolution shall replace the Sif Oidak negotiating team
6	established by Resolution No. 99-244 and affirmed by Resolution No. 09-095.
7	BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that the Nation's negotiating team is directed to communicate at least
8	twice a year with the districts of the Nation affected by the comprehensive water
9	claims settlement to provide updates and seek comments about the settlement
10	process.
