1	WHEREAS,	the Legislative Council is vested with "all of the legislative powers vested in the Tohono
2		O'odham Nation" and is expressly vested with the power to "enact laws and ordinances
3		for conducting and regulating elections" (Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation,
4		Article V, Section 1; Article VI, Section 1; and subsection 1(g)); and
5	WHEREAS,	pursuant to Article X, Section 7, of the Constitution
6		The Tohono O'odham Council shall enact an election ordinance which shall prescribe
7		rules for the apportionment of representatives to each district council when elections
8		of such representatives are from communities within the district and not from the
9		district at large, and for the setting and holding of primary elections for the offices of
10		chairman and vice chairman of the Tohono O'odham Council and of the district
11	<u> </u>	council, and which shall prescribe the qualifications of candidates, the registration
12		requirements for voting and such other rules and procedures necessary to the orderly
13		conduct of elections, including but not limited to procedures for validation of
14		petitions and the settlement of any and all election disputes. The decision of the
15		Tohono O'odham Council in all election matters, including the eligibility and
16		qualifications of candidates, shall be final.

18	WHEREAS,	the Legislative Council has exercised its constitutional authority by adopting the
19		Nation's Uniform Election Ordinance, Ordinance No. 03-86, which is compiled at 12
20		Tohono O'odham Code Chapter 1; and
21	WHEREAS	over several years, the Rules Committee in coordination with the Nation's Election
22		Board has drafted significant amendments to the Uniform Election Ordinance to
23		prescribe qualifications for candidates, simplify and improve voter registration
24		procedures, protect and promote the right to vote by setting deadlines for processing
25		voter registration applications, support members' ability to transfer voter
26		registrations, provide greater access to absentee voting, provide a process for filling
27	ļ	vacancies in elective offices to ensure the Nation's members are fully represented at
28		the district and national levels of government, implement "electronic" voting, and to
29		make additional amendments in the best interest of the Nation and its members; and
30	WHEREAS	, the draft amendments were distributed throughout the Nation, posted on the
31		Legislative Branch website, and presented at numerous public hearings, resulting in
32	1	more than 100 written and oral public comments; and
33	WHEREAS	s, the Rules Committee fully reviewed all comments and incorporated additional

revisions into the redrafted law; and

(Adopting and Codifying Amendments to Uniform Election Ordinance) Page 2 of 2 WHEREAS, on November 26, 2012 the Legislative Council adopted Resolution No. 12-467, 1 "Adopting and Codifying Amendments to Uniform Election Ordinance," but the 2 resolution was vetoed and the veto was not overridden by the required two-thirds 3 majority vote; and 4 WHEREAS, in response to Legislative Council debates on the amendments and the veto, the Rules 5 Committee has modified the draft Uniform Election Ordinance amendments to be 6 codified at Tohono O'odham Nation, Title 12, Tohono O'odham Code, Chapter 1 -7 Elections, which are dated for reference December 2012 and which are incorporated 8 by this reference. 9 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council amends the 10 Uniform Election Ordinance and adopts as an ordinance of the Tohono O'odham 11 Nation Title 12, Tohono O'odham Code, Chapter 1 – Elections as dated for reference 12 December 2012; provided that the special election for Referendum No. 02-12 shall be 13 conducted in accordance with the provisions of the Uniform Election Ordinance that 14 were in effect on October 24. 2012. 15 The foregoing Resolution was defeated by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council on the ${f 05^{TH}}$ Day 16 of DECEMBER, 2012 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1.041.40 FOR; 17 1,739.20 AGAINST;[02] NOT VOTING; and [01] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council 18 by Article V, Section 1 and 2; Article VI, Section 1(g) and 1(l); Article X, Section 7; Article XIII; Article 19 XIV; and Article XV of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono 20 O'odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary -21 Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 22 23 24 Stat. 984).
